--Dallas Coach Jack Jones and Meyers boss Mick Gorham took in the ACC title game along with Wayne Dwyer, Bob Durand, Jim Cross and Jiggs McGuire. They paid visit to Terps' coaching offices before the game and Jones informed us he's still undecided about coaching again next season. We kinda feel he'll be back.

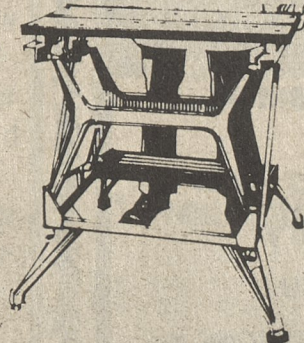
