## Consumer education class planned by 11th

A new inservice course is available free of charge to area teachers of Business Education, Home Economics and Social Studies through an ESEA Title IVC grant. Administered by Luzerne Intermediate Unit 18, the grant is entitled Consumer Skills through Simulation Techniques.

During its first year, this project will assist educators in the Lake Lehman, Northwest, Pittston Area and Wilkes-Barre Area School Districts to develop and implement an interdisciplinary, supplemental consumer education program which

emphasizes the use of realistic life experiences to teach consumer competencies.

One of the services available through the project is the free, three-credit inservice course which will acquaint teachers with information concerning current issues, teaching strategies, instructional materials and community resources in consumer education. The remaining eight school districts in L.I.U. No. 18 will be eligible to participate in project services during the second and third years of the program.

Classes will be held on Tuesday evenings from January 9, through April 17, from 6 p.m. - 9 p.m. at the Luzerne Intermediate Unit building, Kingston. Anyone wishing further information may contact Ms. Jane Grogan, Project Director at 287-9681.
