Johnson will speak on "Birding by Habitat" and is also expected to provide a report on the local Christmas Bird Count. The count is conducted nationally by the Audubon Society through its individual chapters and members.

Locally, Johnson and

other volunteers conduct the count by visiting proper birding areas, such as the Huntsville Dam area, and counting individual species of birds and the number of individual birds in each. The counters rely on sight and sound, working before dawn and after dusk.

The local Audubon meeting will be held at College Misericordia on Dec. 18 at 7:30 p.m. Board members will meet at 6:30 p.m.

The meetings are held in Kennedy Lounge on campus and are open to persons interested in learning more about the Audubon Society as well as to chapter members.
