The Economic Development Council of Northeastern Pennsylvania announced today that Executive Director Howard J. Grossman of Dallas has been elected to serve a two-year term as a member of the board of directors of the Pennsylvania Council on Economic Education.

The newly formed economic education organization has its purpose the goal of providing an economic education resource within Pennsylvania by encouraging the study, coordination and sponsorship of ways and means of promoting economic education.

Other goals are to en-

courage public and private schools, colleges and universities to make their full contribution to the furtherance of economic understanding, to encourage and finance research, training and publications in the field of economic education, and to encourage cooperative working relationships among professional groups, like organizations and other agencies in

promoting the understanding of the economic principles.

The Pennsylvania Council on Economic Education recently employed a full-time executive director. Current president of the Economic Education Council is Robert C. Wilburn, president of Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

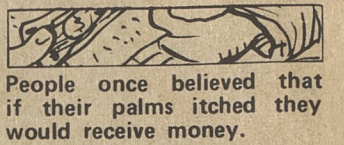

nomineeship in The American College of Hospital Administrators, according to an announcement by Richard J. Stull, President of the Chicago-based professional society.

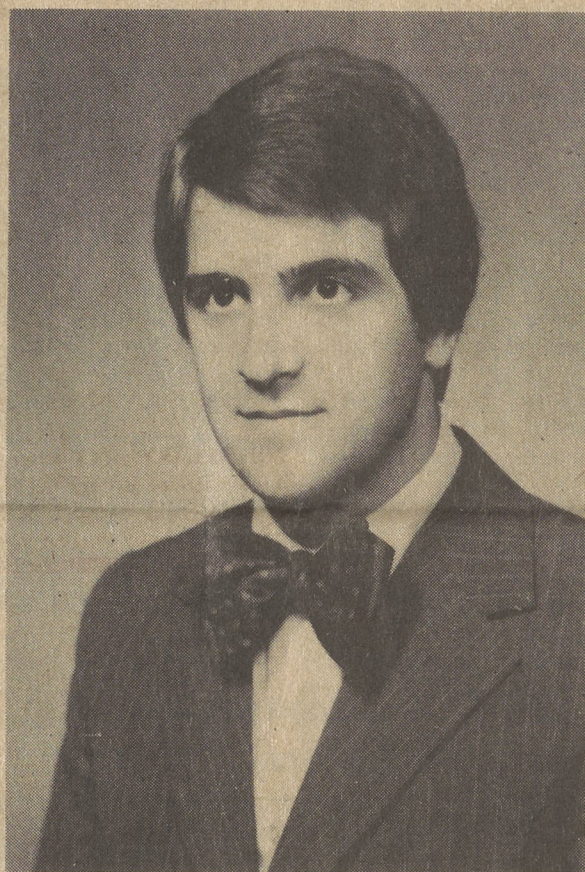
In his new affiliation, Ouellette will join a personal membership organization composed of the leading chief executive officers and their administrative colleagues serving hospitals and
