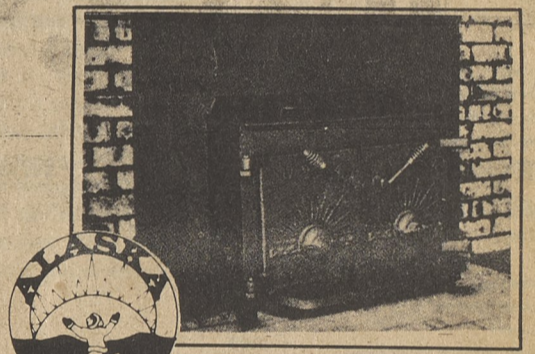
had an active role in the senior play. Eileen also plays guitar and sings with the folk group and choir of Our Lady of Victory Church, Harveys Lake.

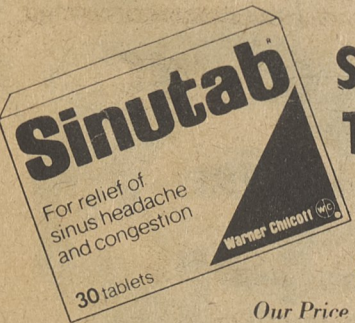

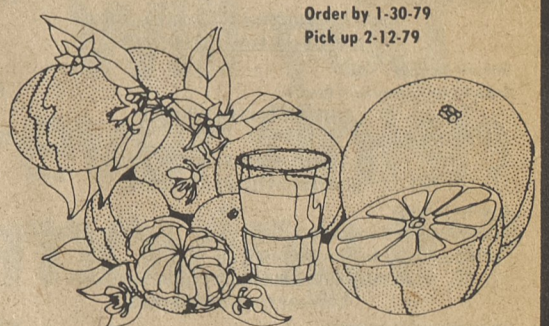
