The Huntsville Methodist Church was founded in 1820. State to tighten requirements

Proposed regulations governing the state Health Department's school immunization program would eliminate the 90-day grace period now permitted children entering school for the first time at the kindergarten and first grade level.

State Health Secretary Dr. Leonard Bachman said that the proposed regulations "require that a child be fully immunized prior to admission to school for the first time."

"A child who is partially immunized or who is unimmunized would no longer be admitted to school."

The Health Secretary said the law requires immunization against diphtheria, tetanus, polio, measles, and rubella (German measles) as a basis to being admitted to school for the first time.

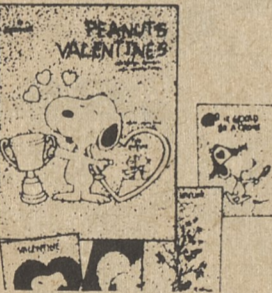
