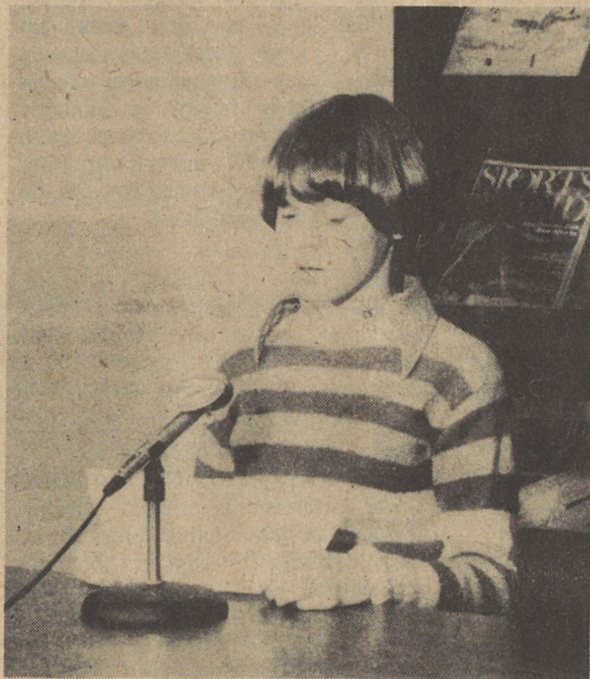

The gathering was held in the Wallace F. Stettler Learning Resources Center on the college prep school campus.

Those attending represented schools from throughout the nation, the farthest being Arizona with others coming from the New England and Middle States areas.

The testing program came into being in 1956 to develop a test that would offer to all applicants, on a common basis, an assessment of their readiness for entry into college-preparatory studies; and second, to assure that the school an applicant proposes to enter is appropriate to his or her goals.
