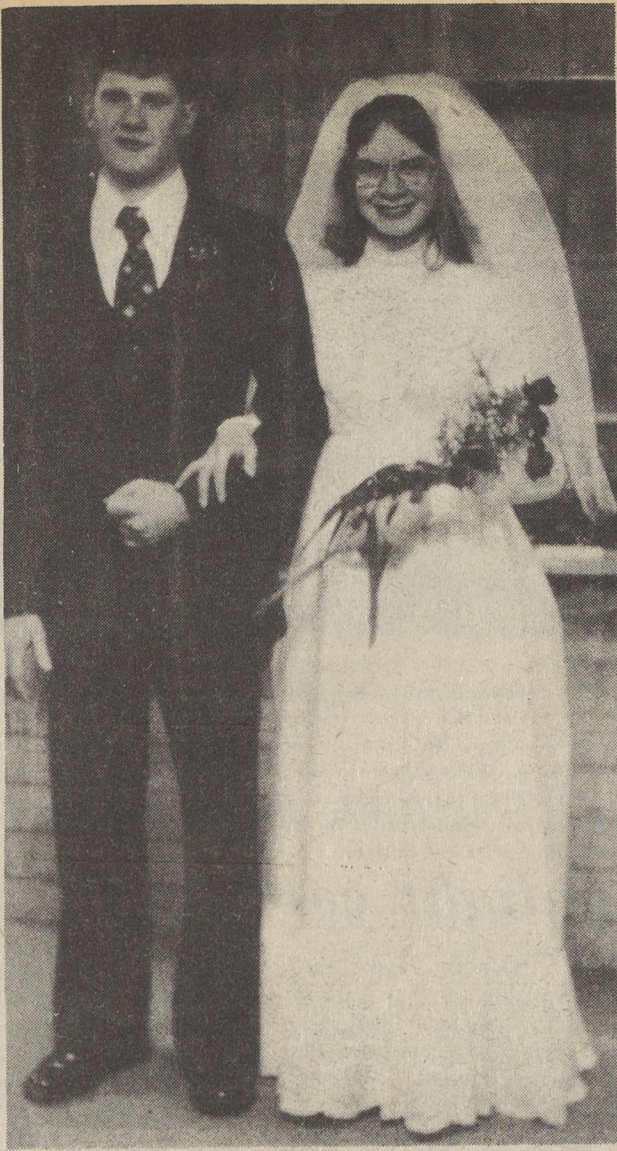


Barbacci home on kitchen tour

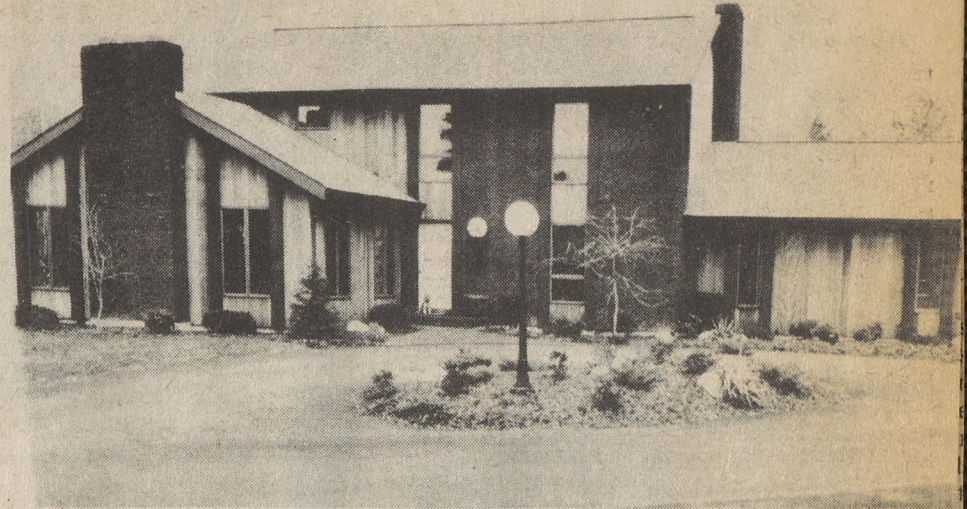
At 11:30 and 1:30 p.m. a luncheon and cooking demonstration will be held by Andy Perugino in
