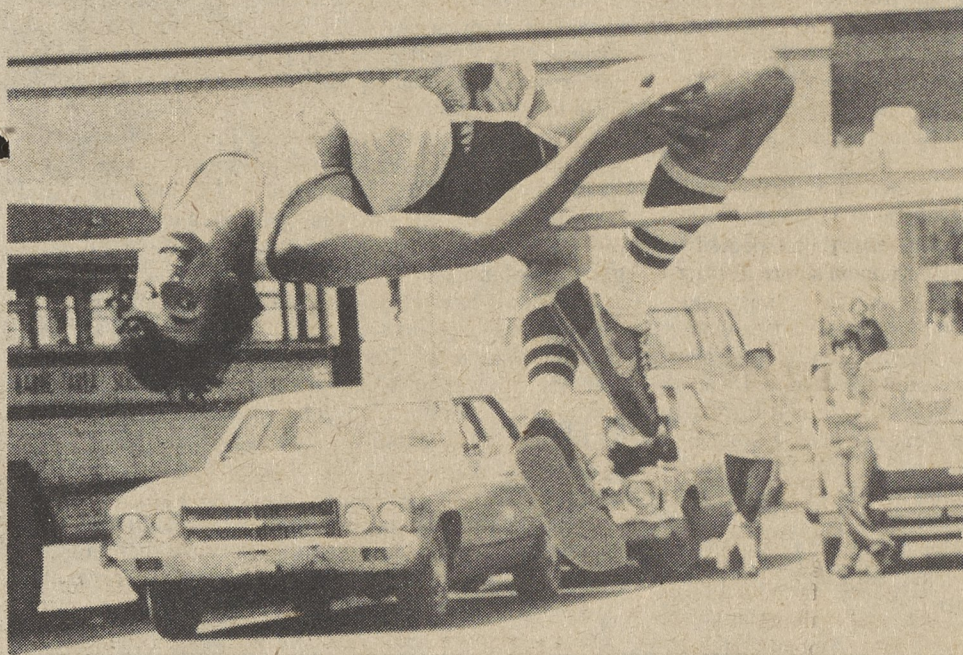


Lake-Lehman track carnival

Carl Siglin and Jim Barbacci of Noxen, co-

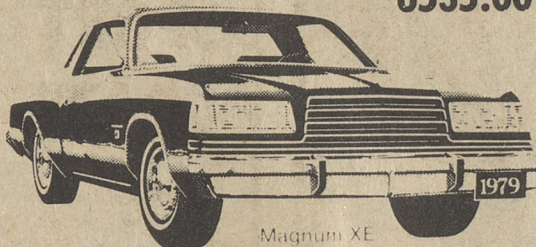

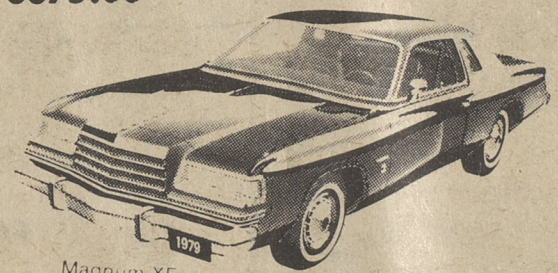

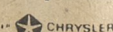
