According to Dallas Borough Police Ptlm. John Fowler went after the cyclists after observing Wagner lifting the front wheel of his cycle off the ground while driving.

Wagner then, police report, failed to stop while being pursued, tried to force the cruiser off the road, fought with the arresting officer, and used obscene language while being led off.
