Franklin Volunteers buy \$4,700 of radios

Franklin Township Volunteer Fire Company has announced purchase of about \$4,700 worth of radio equipment for its firehouse in Orange. Included in the purchase were three new radios for use in the three trucks owned by the company; a second portable walkie-talkie and an FM based station for the firehouse.

The new radio FM equipment was necessary as fire company volunteers were running into trouble getting messages because of the 'static' encountered from the large amount of CB operators jamming the air waves in the area.

Franklin Township Volunteer Fire Compnay has received a matching grant of \$2,000 for part payment of the new equipment from the state Department of Forest and Waters, it was announced.

Those weekly fire school and training sessions that keep Franklin Township's

volunteer firefighters busy nights paid off on Sunday when the Orange firemen captured two handsome trophies in the Back Mountain Firemen's 'Olympics' Sunday at the Lehman fair grounds.

A team from the Orange fire company captured a first place in the 'drafting' competition-pumping with

a fire truck from a portable tank-and placed second in the high pressure pumping event, using a firetruck only. Trucksville fire company placed first in this event, finishing in 44 seconds, two seconds ahead of the Franklin Township team.

Members of the Franklin Township teams were

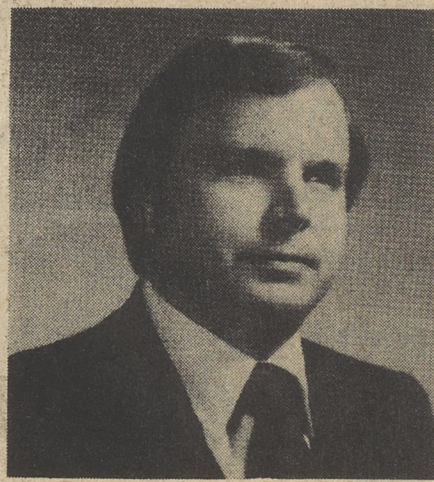
