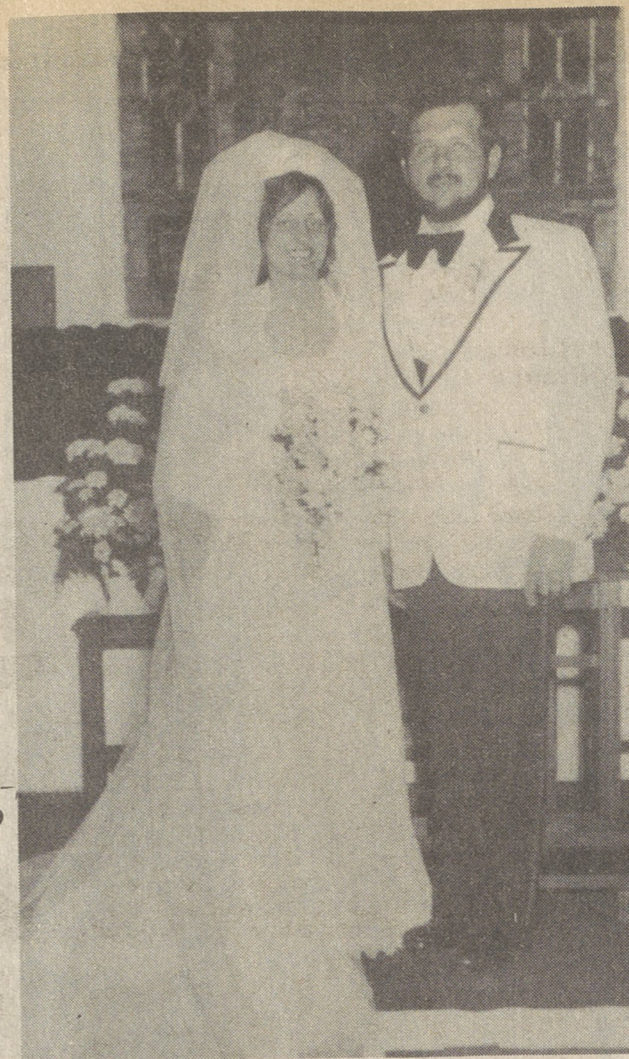
St. Paul's members honored
