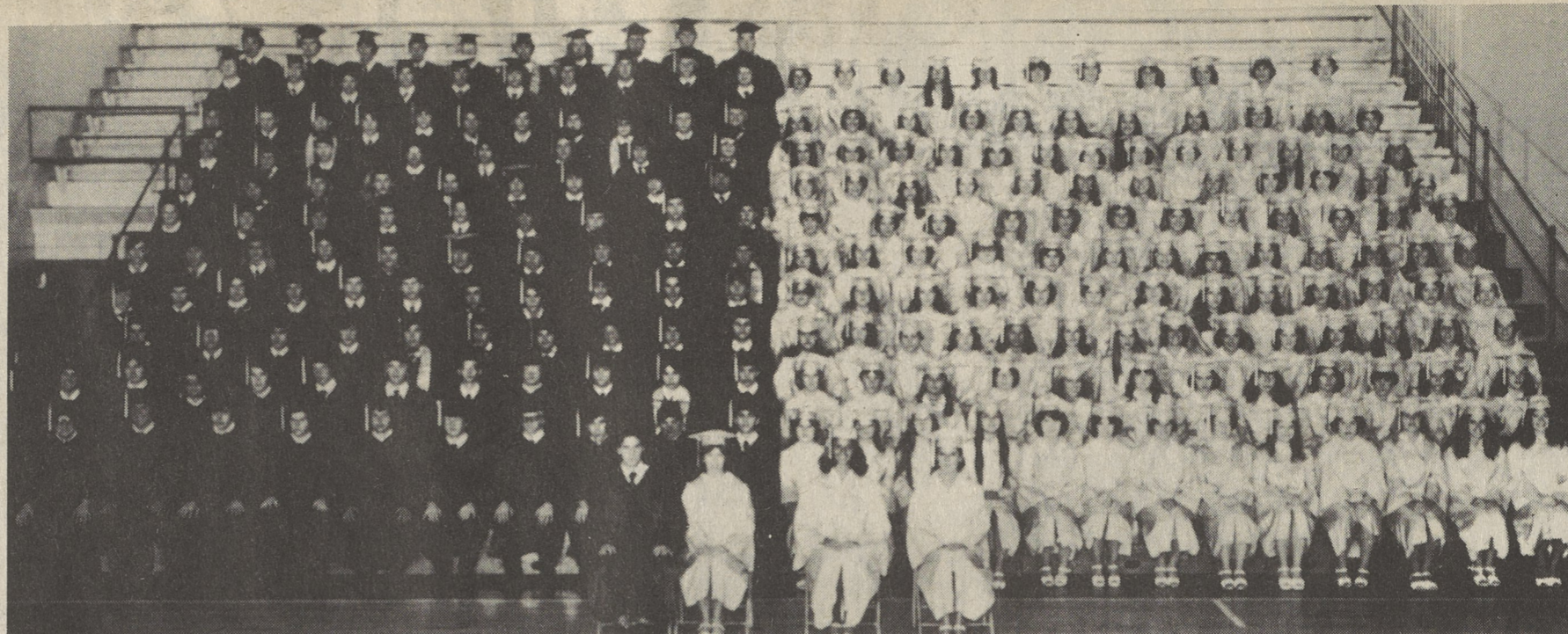
Dallas Senior High School will hold its commencement ceremony on Wednesday, June 6, 1979, 6 p.m., at the senior high school football stadium.

Susan Petty receives business award

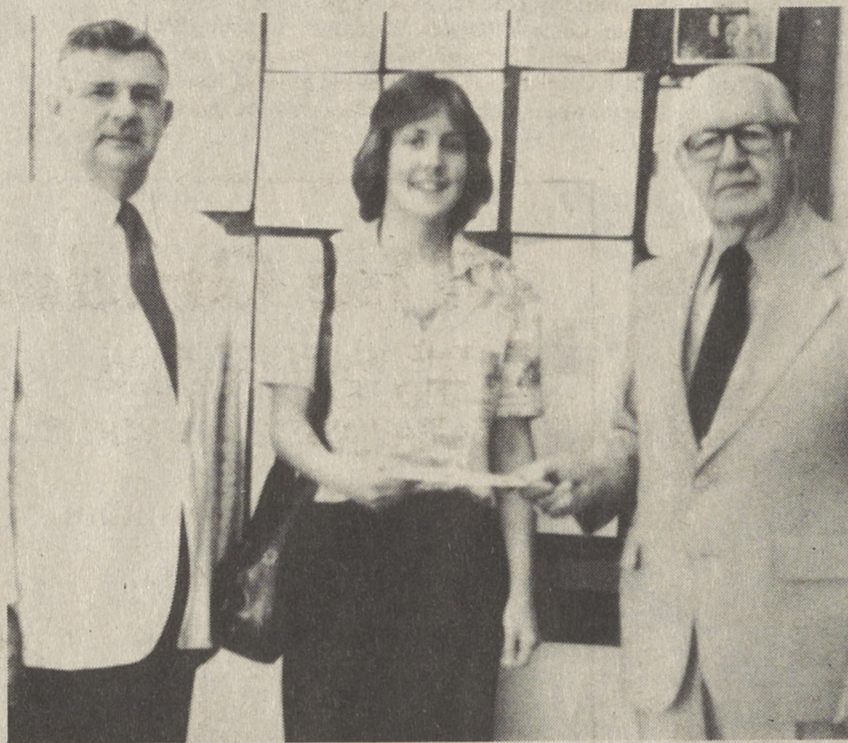

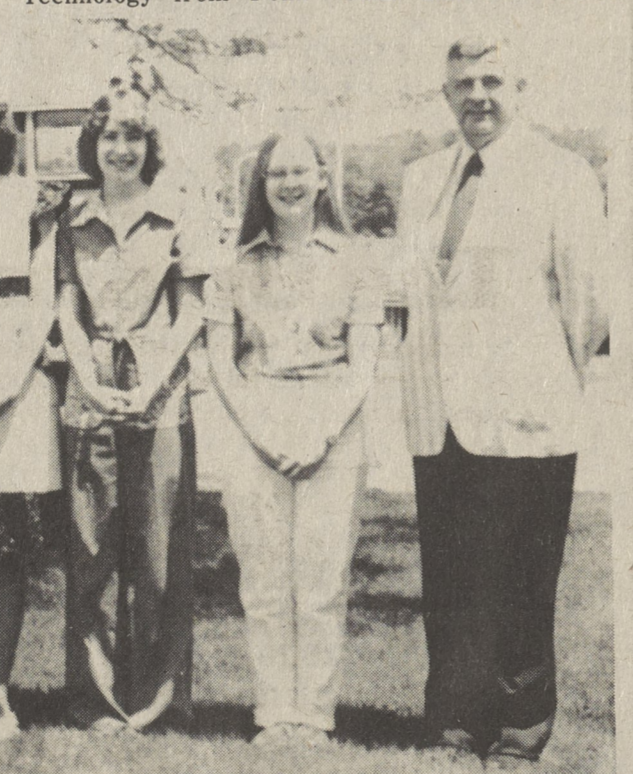

Two sophomore boys from Dallas Senior High School have been chosen to attend the "Leaders Rotary Camp". These boys are Andy Krivak and Bob Rose.

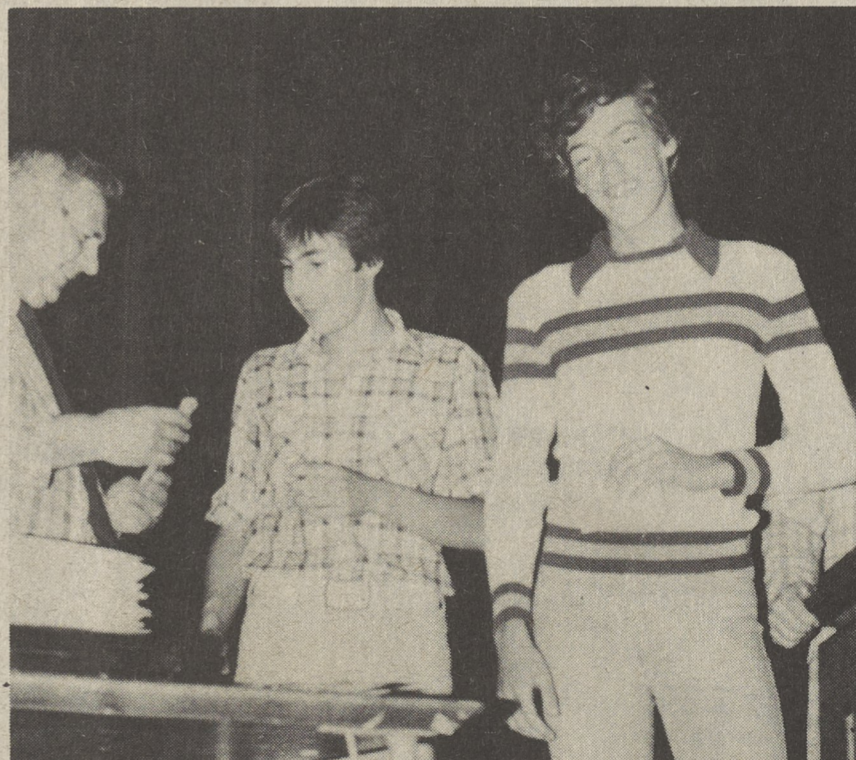
