Edward F. Mark, Sr., R.D. 2, Hunlock Creek, was recently appointed to serve on the Pennsylvania School Boards Association Commission To Strengthen The Values of Public Education.

The purpose of the Commission is to conduct a study and review of the standard of values commonly used in the public schools of the Commonwealth. The study shall be directed at determining what may be done by school officials and parents to improve and strengthen, the standards of values now used, especially as they relate to personal freedom and responsibility in a republic

based upon enterprise.

The object of the study is to make recommendations that may be considered by local school officials, parents and the general public, and state officials in dealing with the improvement of values that should be implicit in the public schools.

The Commission is composed of equal numbers of school board members, public school children parents who do not have official ties to a local school district, school superintendents or their designated other administrators, and teachers who can effectively serve in helping determine current standards of value and how they may be

strengthened.

Mark, a licensed practicing psychologist, serves as a school director in the Lake-Lehman School District. He will be representing the school directors in Region 7 which includes Lackawanna, Luzerne, Susquehanna,

Wayne and Wyoming counties.

Dr. Thomas O'Donnell, Wilkes-Barre Area School director, is director of PSBA Region 7.

The commission will convene on June 16 at the Hershey Convention Center.
