College Misericordia names dean

Sister Marie Dolores Moore, R.S.M., Ph.D., has been named academic dean of College Misericordia, according to an announcement by Rev. William B. Hill, acting president of the College.

An associate professor of music and former chairperson of the music department, Sister Marie Dolores was selected for the chief academic position through a special search process conducted by members of the faculty and administration.

She succeeds Sister Carolyn Burgholzer, R.S.M., in the position.

Sister is a graduate of College Misericordia with a Master's degree in Music from DePaul University in Chicago. She received her Ph.D. in Music from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. Additional study was performed in Europe with Sister earning diplomas from the Ecole Normale de Musique and the Institut de Musicologie, both in France.

Sister Marie Dolores has served as an evaluator for the National Association of Schools of Music and recently served as a

special guest speaker for that organization during its annual meeting held in Chicago.

At College Misericordia,

she has been responsible for initiating the college's current major in Music Therapy, one of 29 programs in the entire country, and has been active in a number of music related activities.

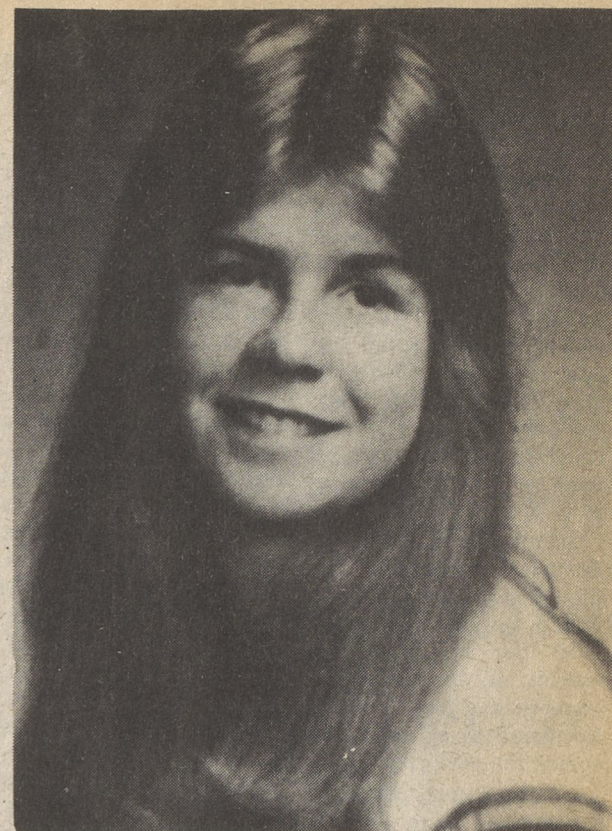
She helped found and lead, as a member of the board of directors, the Sinfonia da Camera chamber orchestra, and has served as the music director of Misericordia's annual Christmas Madrigal Dinner. For the latter, she has researched and instituted music authentic to the period represented by the Christmas affair.

She has served as chairperson of College Misericordia's Cultural Events Committee.

Sister Marie Dolores will assume the responsibilities of academic dean immediately, working directly with incoming Misericordia President Dr. Joseph R. Fink and a faculty of some 100 part-time and full-time professors.

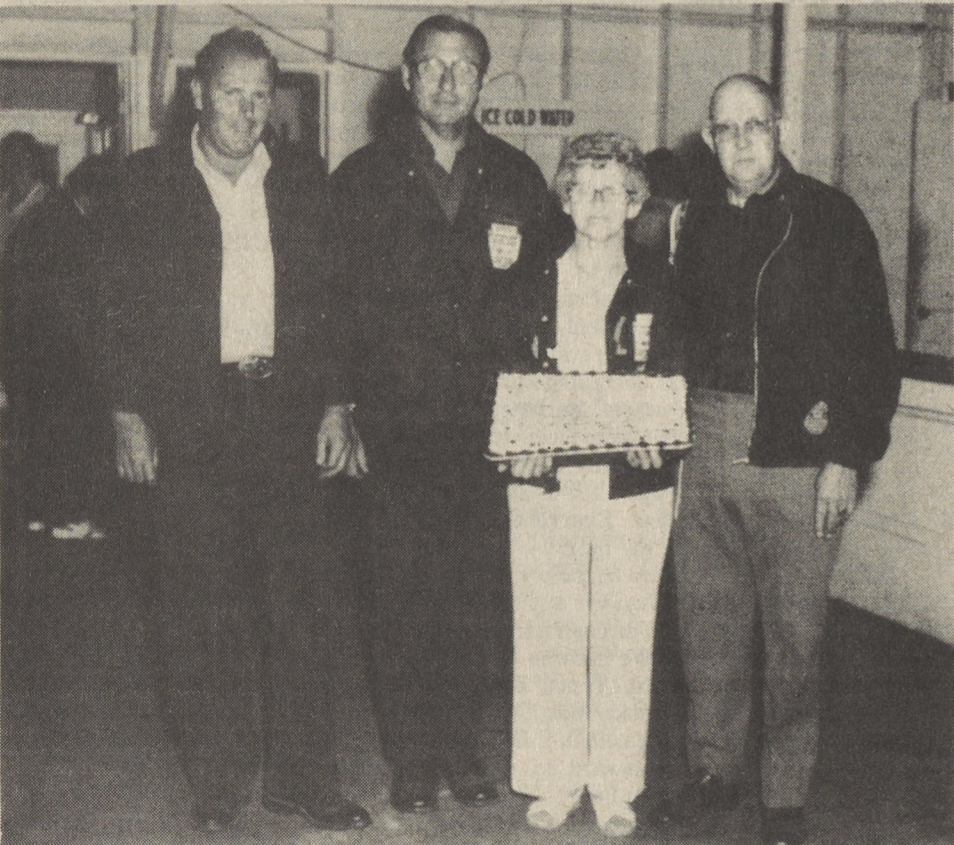

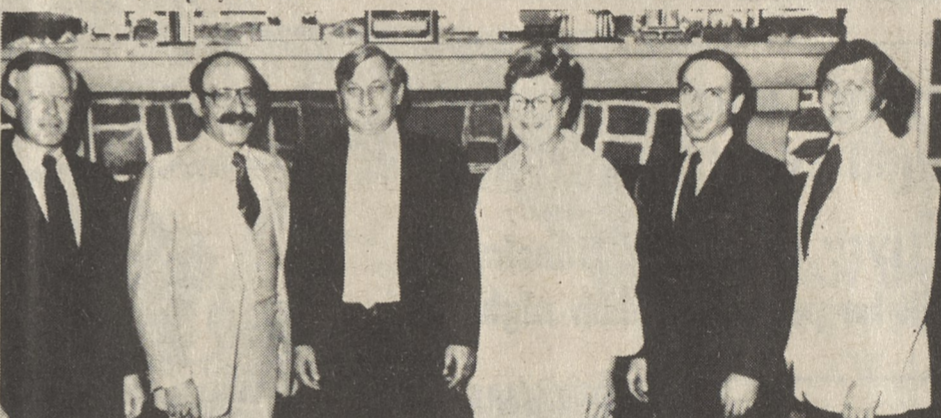
