Gasoline will make you sick

A swallow of gasoline in your stomach is going to make you very sick. A drop of gasoline in your lungs will probably kill you.

In 1974, when we experienced a gas shortage similar to today's, at least one Pennsylvanian died because he used his mouth to siphon gasoline. Gasoline is a poison. In the stomach it acts as an irritant. Small amounts of ingested gas will cause

a great deal of pain and discomfort. It can also cause irritation and ulceration of the digestive tract.

But the real danger for a person who has swallowed gasoline lies in the possibility that he or she may vomit. If this happens, there is extreme danger that some of the gasoline will enter the lungs.

Even one or two drops of gasoline in the lungs

may be fatal. The gasoline causes chemical pneumonitis, a condition which permanently damages the lungs and often leads to death.

If you accidentally swallow gasoline or discover someone who has, do not induce vomiting. Keep the person calm and get them to medical care as quickly as possible. But remember—don't induce vomiting. Gasoline is a pain in the stomach but a killer in the lungs.
