### Karchner opposes lobby bill

Ellsworth E. Karchner of Trucksville, recently participated in a special telephone alert urging citizen opposition to a bill which would adversely

affect current lobby laws if certain proposed amendments are included.

As a member of Citizen's Choice, a national grass roots

organization, Karchner indicated that opposition to the bill is based on two proposed amendments which would seriously impede the work of hundreds of grass roots organizations across the country.

"If Congress supports these amendments, Citizen's Choice and others may be required to violate their members' privacy by revealing membership lists," warns Karchner. "In addition, excessive paperwork and reporting requirements would skyrocket costs and make it difficult for organizations such as ours to carry out their commitments to members. Such bureaucratic obstructions would deprive citizens of their constitutional right to petition the government, a right afforded by the First Amendment."
