Cross Valley design work to proceed

A contract for design work on the Cross Valley Expressway in Wilkes-Barre has been awarded to a Scranton firm, according to Senator Frank J. O'Connell.

Sen. O'Connell commented that he is pleased with Transportation Secretary Tom Larson's decision because of the benefits that the highway will give to both motorists and the business community of Wilkes-Barre.

"This is a much-needed addition to the highway system in Luzerne County and one that has been in the planning stages for a long time. I am glad to see it moving ahead," the Senator said.

Bellante, Clauss, Miller and Partners, Inc., were authorized to proceed with design work on the one-mile long, two-lane relocation, four-lane right-of-way program on the portion of the expressway from River Street to Wilkes-Barre Boulevard, Larson said.

Larson explained that the \$93,000 contract will be paid for with \$65,000 federal funds and \$28,000 in state matching money.

The project was put on hold in December of 1978 when the Department ran short of funds to continue its long-range highway program.

The Secretary expressed his pleasure at announcing the restoration of the project which is vital to the economic development of the region and will alleviate traffic problems in downtown Wilkes-Barre.

Home Health increases Back Mt. visits

Home-Health Services of Luzerne County made 845 more visits to the homes of Back Mountain patients in fiscal year 1978-79 than it did in 1977-78.

The non-profit agency's visiting nurses and aides made 3,696 home care visits to Back Mountain patients from July 1, 1978 to June 30, 1979. Visits over the prior year totalled 2,851.

Kingston Township received the most Home-Health visits, with 1,172. There were 827 health care visits to Dallas Borough homes, and 392 in Dallas Township. Harvey's Lake Borough was visited 684 times; Franklin Township, 202; Jackson Township, 52;
