Mrs. Thompson is the former Miss Bertha Boone, daughter of Mrs. Grace Boone of Hunlocks Creek, and the late Albert

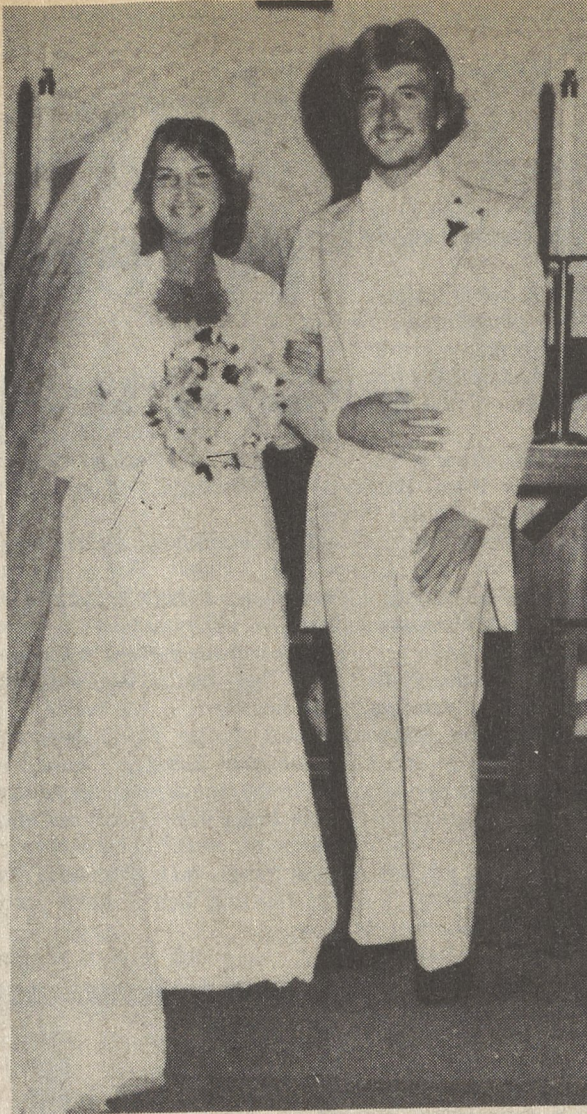
