

# Prince of Peace to celebrate 50th

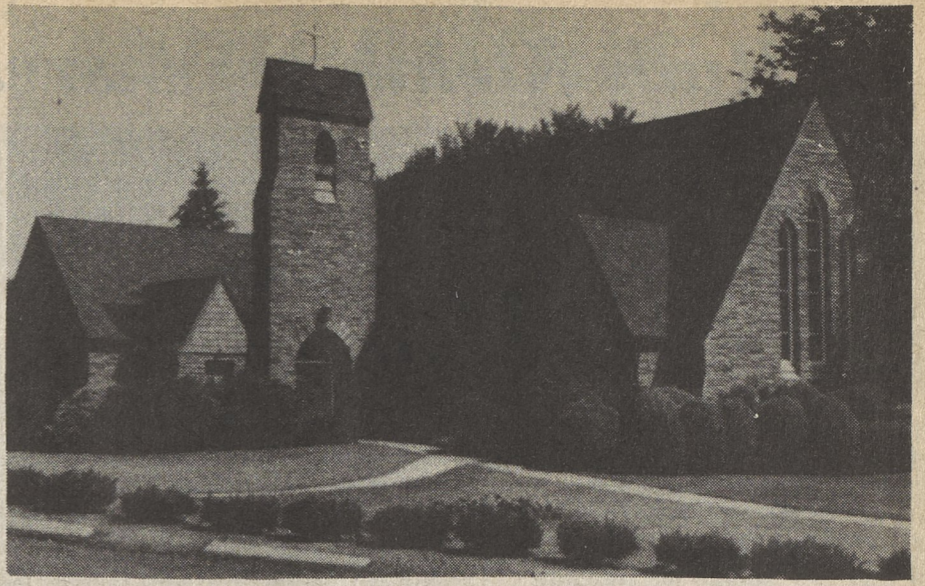
The Prince of Peace Episcopal Church of Main Street, Dallas will celebrate the 50th year of the founding of the church on Oct. 14th. The church was originally begun on Oct. 13, 1929 with 25 Episcopalians meeting in the Shavertown School Building.

Services were held in St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Shavertown until 1937. After a temporary halt during the economic depression, the church was reactivated in 1949. Ground breaking for the present building on Main Street was held in September, 1949, making that building 30 years old this fall.

The church was a mission of the Diocese of Bethlehem until 1961, when it became self-supporting during the term of the Rev. William McClelland. The Rev. John S. Prater became rector of the Prince of Peace in September of 1962.

The Golden Jubilee celebration will begin with a service of reaffirmation and thanksgiving on Oct. 14th at 10 a.m. in the church. The Venerable John Coble, Archdeacon of the Diocese of Bethlehem, will celebrate the Eucharist and preach the sermon. A coffee hour will be held in the parish house after this service.

From 3:30 to 4 p.m., a fruit punch reception will be held at the church and the anniversary banquet is scheduled for 4 p.m. A roast beef dinner will be catered and served by the committee. The Right Reverend Lloyd Gressle, Bishop of Bethlehem, and Mrs. Gressle will attend the banquet. Reservation deadline for the banquet is Oct. 5th to the church office.

One of the highlights of the anniversary celebration will be the preparation of an anniversary program.
