An active student, Lee Ann has been a strutter for two years and a member of both chorus and Choristers during her sophomore, junior and presently in her senior

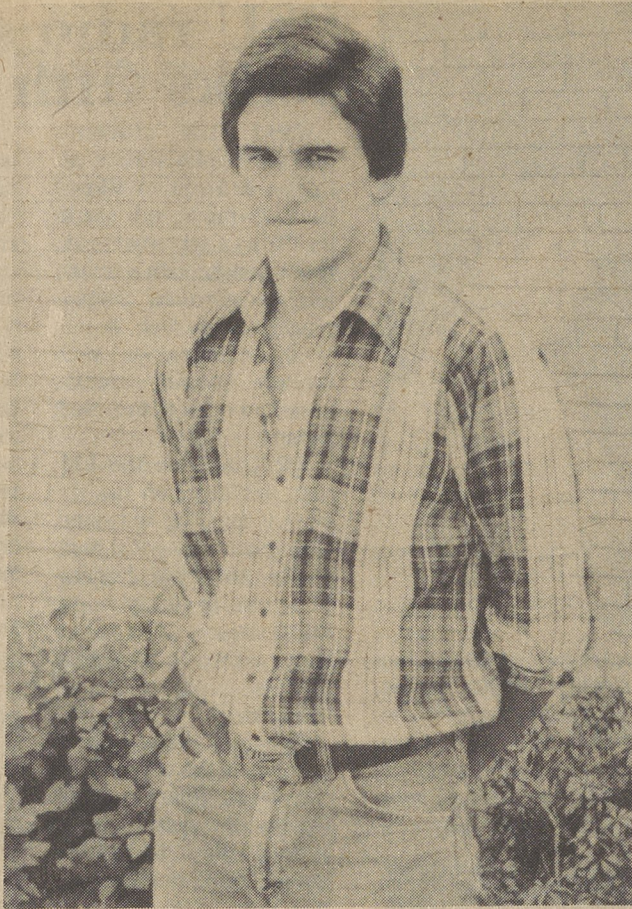
year. This year Lee Ann will be trying out for District Chorus at Montrose High School.
