

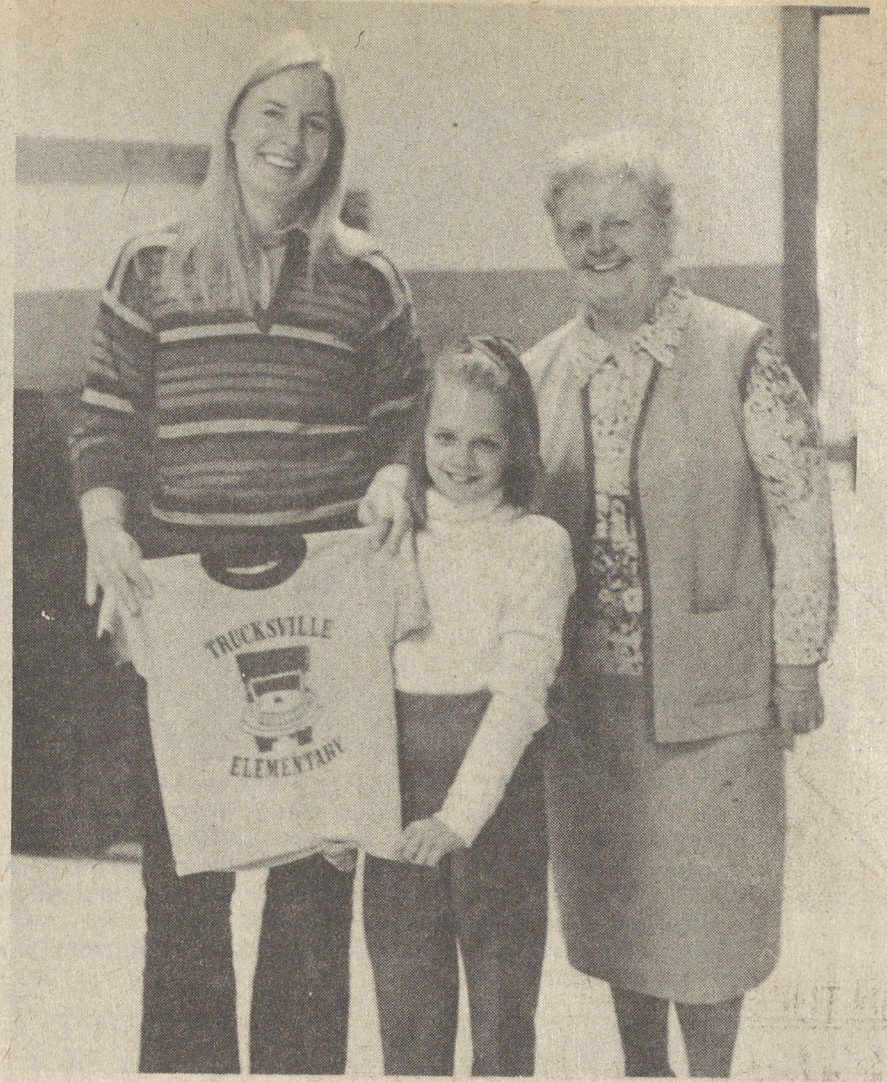


HALLOWEEN PARTY--Westmoreland Elementary students were entertained at a Halloween party by members of the PTO. Left to right are Tami Landon,

"Digger," the computer behind the Dallas Informational Guidance System, has been working hard since the beginning of school at Dallas High School. Mrs. Rita Lyons, project aide, has been working individually with students who wish to use the computer for career searches, two-year and

four-year college searches, and Armed Services exploration. According to Diane Hunt, project director and senior counselor, seniors are being given priority time on the computer through December. In addition, all seniors will be meeting in small groups to discuss occupational plans and

school application procedures. "One very important feature of the computer is the Financial Aid File," according to Mrs. Hunt. "Through this computerized search a student can locate

scholarships, grants, and loans applicable to his particular qualifications in a matter of minutes." Students and parents are encouraged to use the Dallas Informational Guidance System to its fullest. It has been par-

tially funded through ESEA Title 4-C funds. Contact can be simply made through Mrs. Lyons, or the student's counselor. Mrs. Barbara Price is sophomore counselor; John Farkas is junior counselor.

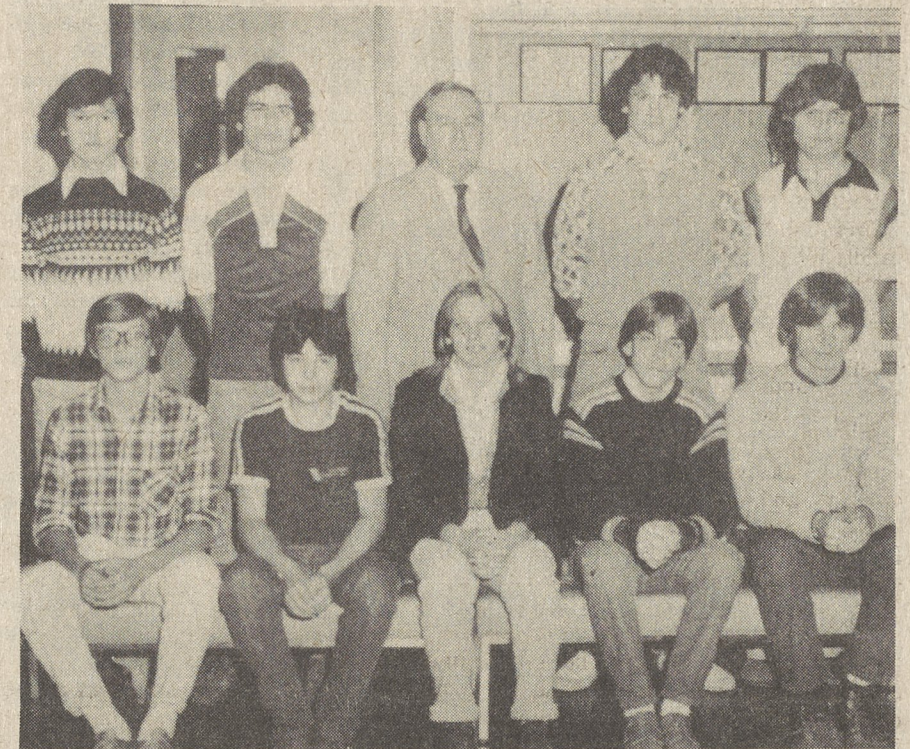
"classroom chatter" are planned for the school year. The first issue will come out early in November. For her prize, Jennifer won a Truckville School T-shirt. T-shirts and

Miliauskas to speak to L-J PTA meeting

The Lehman-Jackson PTA meeting will be held Nov. 7, at 7:30 p.m. in the Multi-Purpose Room of the Lehman Elementary Building. Speaker for the evening will be John Miliauskas, director of the Lake-Lehman Band. Miliauskas will speak on the importance and the many achievements of the band. Miliauskas also will show a film of the band competition at "Six Flags over Georgia Music Festival" in Spring of 1979. The band won 3 Superior ratings in Concert, Field, Show and Pass-in-Review. They

also won the Band Overall Trophy and were named Grand National Champs. The band has 150 trophies to their credit with 19 earned just last year. So far this year they captured 8. Miliauskas is a graduate of Lehman High School and former member of its band. He has been the director of the award-winning Lake-Lehman High School Band for the past 23 years. He is an alumnus of Mansfield State College and a life member of Phi Mu Alpha National Honor Fraternity. He is also a member of the Penn-

sylvania Music Educators Association PMEA and PSEA. In 1959 he received the National Recognition Award from the Dallas Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs and in 1970 was named "Man of the Year" by the American Legion Post 967, Harveys Lake. Again in 1973, the Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs honored the band and its director in recognition of musical accomplishments. In 1972, national recognition was given him in the publication "Ruffles and Flourishes". He was guest conductor for the Country Music Festival in 1976 and also hosted PMEA-Northeast District Band. He was named "Outstanding Director" at the Sherbourne, NY, Pageant of Bands in 1971 and again

in 1977. In 1978 he was honored by Local 140 American Federation of Musicians, of which he is a member, for his dedication and development of young musicians. These are just a few of the personal accomplishments of this outstanding man who has dedicated his ambitions to help the youth of our area toward a meaningful goal. Miliauskas is our 'Man of the Year' every year. Lake-Lehman Band Sponsors Association will be on hand after the meeting to sell band records and cook books. Refreshments will be served.
