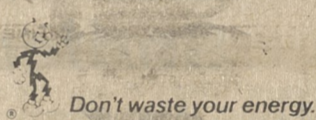
To Residential Customers

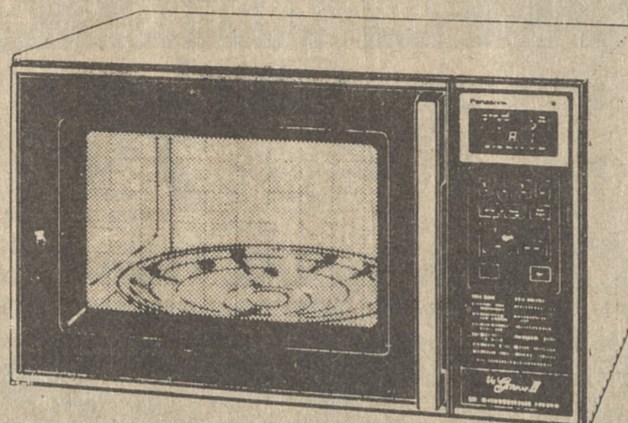
