## Police Reports

### Nichols, Brace sent to court

In two separate hearings Tuesday, two Harveys Lake residents were bound over to Luzerne County Court to stand trial on drug charges. Simultaneously they were arraigned on another drug charge and scheduled for a hearing in Wyoming County next week.

Bound over were George Nichols and Diane Brace after District Magistrate Leonard Harvey of Dallas and District Magistrate Earl Gregory of Shavertown ruled that prima facie cases existed.

Before Magistrate Harvey, Nichols was ordered to stand trial on two counts of possession and delivery and Brace on one count. Nichols' earlier bail of \$10,000 per count was continued, while Brace was released on her own recognizance after bail was initially set at \$10,000 for one count.

Before Magistrate Gregory Nichols was continued in his original \$5,000 bail on one count of possession and delivery, while Brace was released on her own recognizance after bail was initially set at \$5,000 for one count.

At the same time Magistrate Gregory scheduled for Dec. 27 at 2 p.m. before District Magistrate Herbert Downs of Tunkhannock a hearing for the two one count of possession and delivery. Bail for each was set at \$5,000 with bail arrangements pending as of press time.

Each incident alleged against the two involved a reported sale of drugs to an undercover agent of the Pennsylvania State Police earlier this year.

## Postmasters ask aid in clearing boxes

Rural Mail Carriers expect to deal with more than their share of snow and sleet and freezing rain, but Postmaster Bernard Gawlas today reminded customers in the Dallas Area that his carriers will need some assistance during winter months.

Rural carriers will make every reasonable effort to serve as many customers as possible during severe winter weather, but Gawlas said carriers are not expected to leave their vehicles and provide service on foot when roads, entire blocks, or other large portions of their routes are impassable.

Gawlas said his office keeps in close contact with traffic and weather advisories to determine if delivery should be suspended on a particular day, and with highway department officials to make sure public roads are passable and in good repair.

"We need everyone's cooperation in keeping approaches to boxes clear of snow and any other obstructions," Gawlas said, "so we can avoid cutting anyone's mail delivery even temporarily."

Postmaster John Tosh of Harveys Lake and Postmaster Armande Casagnade of Noxen also asked the cooperation of the customers in their delivery areas in keeping the approaches to their mail boxes clear of all obstructions during the winter season.

### Vandalism, breakin investigated

Dallas Twp. Police are investigating a pair of incidents involving vandalism and forced entry at the homes of township residents last week.

Ronald Ashton, Mt. Olivet Rd., told police on Sunday that someone cut down a pine tree in his yard and took it, while last Tuesday Louis Bradbury, Ryman Rd., reported to police that a forced entry was made to his home, though nothing of value seemed to have been taken.

### Hit-run driver sought

An Idetown woman's car was damaged by a hit-run driver along the Harveys Lake highway early Friday morning, according to Dallas Twp. Police.

Martha Steele, 32, Idetown, told police that she was struck by a vehicle that fled the scene, with the accident taking place in the vicinity of the intersection with Center Hill Rd.

Police obtained a partial registration number for the hit-run car, reported to be a Chrysler product containing three passengers—two males and one female.

A Dallas man escaped injury Friday morning when his car left Route 415 near the entrance to Elmerest and struck some trees, according to Dallas Twp. Police.

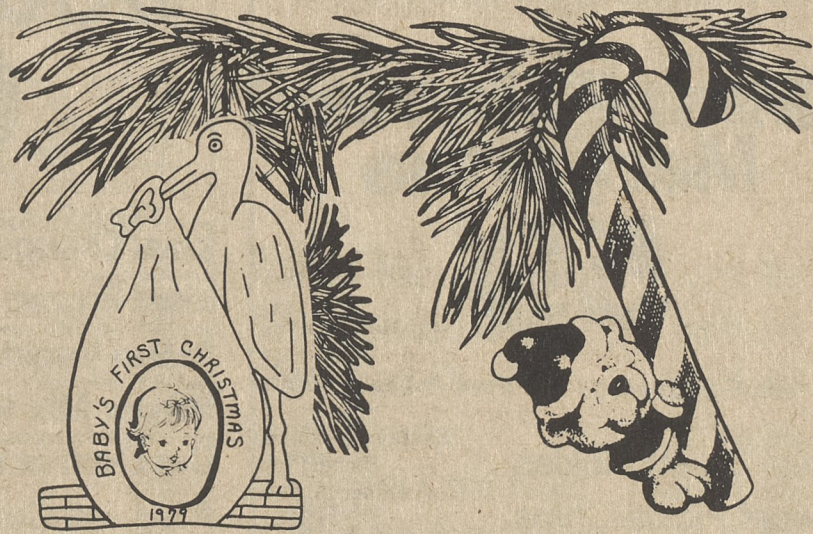
