Historical Society introduces aims, officers

The first meeting of the Harveys Lake Historical Society was

held last week to explain the purpose of the society and its goals. Members

also discussed what is expected from each member of the society.

Election of officers was held with Sandra Serhan named president; Mrs. Peter Savage, vice president; Atty. Charles Petrillo, secretary; and Marguerite Cauda, treasurer.

A summary of what the society hopes to achieve in the near future was listed as follows:

"The Harveys Lake Times", a publication written by various

members and sold at local businesses. It may depict past, present or future happenings, and published once each month.

Gather at least 100 members, active and faithfully supportive and, after the first year, apply for a grant. The grant, if approved, would be used to establish a museum or public library building. It could also be used for housing artifacts of historical value.

Collection of information pertaining to steamboats and personnel, hotels and locations, oldest homes, churches, stores, restaurants, businesses, lumbering industry, schools, forms of transportation, recreational facilities, families, first settlers, families of distinct fame, politics, movie theatres and the Indians.

Various committees will be appointed including entertainment, research, membership, planning, exhibits, and other committees as needed.

The charter banquet will be Jan. 13, 6 p.m., at Harveys Lake Hotel. Reservations may be made with Sandra Serhan 639-5875. Tickets are \$10 per person.

Membership for persons over 65 years of age is free.
