# 'Christ is Risen' theme at St. Andrew's Church

The following Holy Week and Easter schedule has been announced for St. Andrew's Orthodox Church in Dallas by Fr. W. Basil Stroyen.

Thursday, April 3, at 6 p.m., the reading of 12 selections from the Gospels which relate specifically to the days immediately prior to the Crucifixion of Christ, including His experience in the Garden of Gethsemane, His Via Delorosa, the scene at the foot of the Cross, His death upon the Cross and finally the result upon the physical aspects of the environment.

Twelve special candles will be lighted at the beginning of the readings, one will be extinguished after each reading until at the final reading the Church will be almost in total darkness.

Friday at 6 p.m., a service will be held commemorating the Entombment of Christ in the grave of Joseph of Arimathea. The tomb has been decorated by Mrs. William Ostrum. Following the placing of the Shroud-Plaschanitz in the tombs and the singing of the Lamentations, guards will be posted at the tomb. They will read from the Book of

Acts almost continuously from Friday evening until the midnight services.

Saturday at 11:30 p.m., the services for Easter will begin. Matins followed by the Divine Liturgy with communion

will terminate with the blessing of foods in baskets brought to the church. The fast is broken with this blessed food. From midnight until Ascension on May 15, the greeting of Orthodox is

"Christ is Risen."

On Sunday at 2 p.m., the Easter Vespers will be served with the reading of the Gospel in at least six languages. The readers face different directions when they read to

"Proclaim the Risen Christ to all corners of the world."

The week following Easter is called "Bright Week." There is no fasting during this week. "Christ is Risen."
