ice skating and swimming. Although he finds little time for it anymore, Todd used to go camping and hiking quite often.

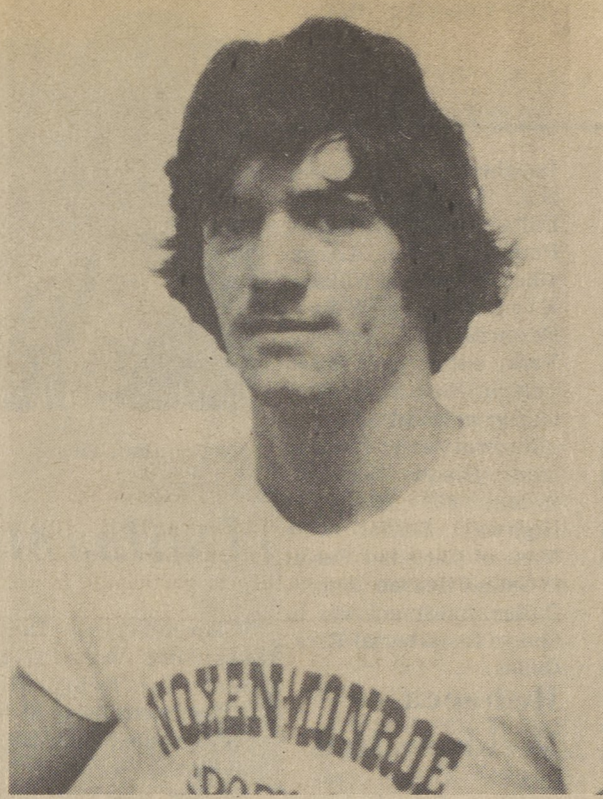
During the summer he works part time.
