

Kunkle continues to rule Horlacher League Teeners

Kunkle continued to rule the roost in the Teeners Division of the Bob Horlacher Memorial League by routing the Beaumont-Jenks nine, 27 to 3, on the latter's field. It was the fourth straight win for Kunkle behind Rusty Bauer's pitching. Bill Horner and Brian Oeller had perfect days at bat for Kunkle, each getting five hits in as many trips to the plate. Rick Clemow and Joe Sickler also had perfect days at the plate, getting three hits in as many trips.

Orange Yankees sent their female ace, Theresa Baseski, to the mound against their neighboring rivals, the Centermoreland Phillies, and the young miss picked up her second mound win of the season as the Yankees, outlasted the Phillies, 20-14, to move into a tie for the runner spot with Centermoreland. For the Yankees, Dan Blessner and Greg Kravitsky hit homers, Kravitsky doing it twice. Bob Morgan had two triples for the Yankees, while Joe Faux

of the Phillies fattened his batting average with a five-for-five day. In Saturday's Teeners' Division games, Centermoreland Phillies and the Orange Yankees were the winners-Centermoreland beating the previously unbeaten Kunkle nine, 15 to 9, and Orange blanked the Beaumont-Jenks squad, 12-0. Kunkle seemed headed for its fifth straight win after taking a 9 to 3 lead but the Centermoreland nine kept pecking away to register the win with a 12

run rally in the fifth frame. Jim Kyttle chalked up the mound win for the Phillies. In the other contest on Saturday, Art Coolbaugh tossed a two-hitter for the Orange Yankees against the Beaumont-Jenks combination. Only three B-J batters reached base in a fast one-hour ball game. Erne Barber had two doubles and came up with a three-for-three performance at the plate; Dan Blessner hit a triple and a double, while Brian Blessner and Mark Roberts had two hits

apiece. Fred Diehl's double and Charlie Corby's single were highlights for the B-J nine. First place will be at stake tomorrow evening at Orange when the league leading Kunkle nine will play the Orange Yankees in a game starting at 6. Saturday's

game in the Teeners' Division will send the Centermoreland Phillies to the Jenks diamond for a game against the B-J's, starting at 4 p.m. Standings of the teams: Kunkle-4-1, .800; Orange and Centermoreland, 3-2, .600 each; Beaumont-Jenks 0-5, .000.

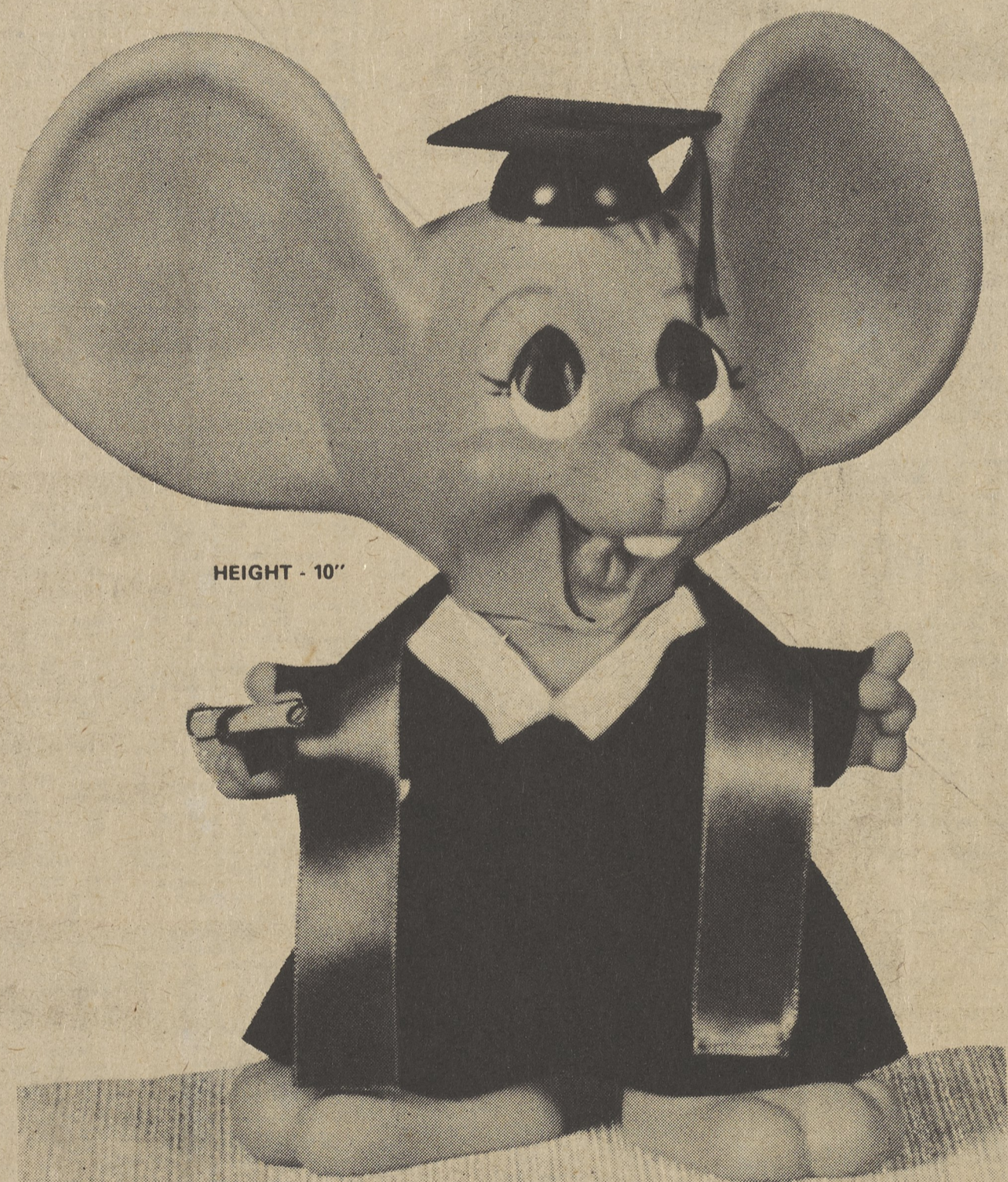
