

Braves hold first

Beaumont Braves took over sole possession of top place in the Majors Division of the Bob Horlacher Memorial Little League by nosing out the Orange Yankees, 13 to 11, for their ninth win in 10 starts. The loss, the second of the season for the Yanks, dropped the Orange team into second place with an 8-2 record.

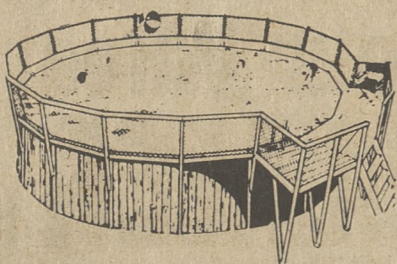
The annual athletic awards assembly of Dallas Senior High School will be held Monday, June 9, at 7 p.m., in the high school auditorium.

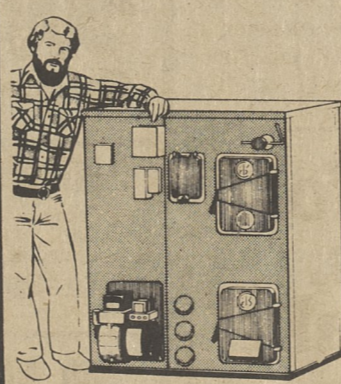
