A member of the junior steering committee, Dave is employed at Perugino's in Luzerne. Dave is an academic student, who is looking forward to attending college following graduation.



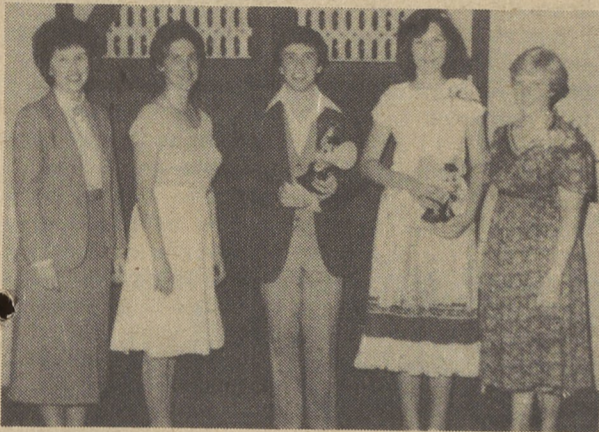

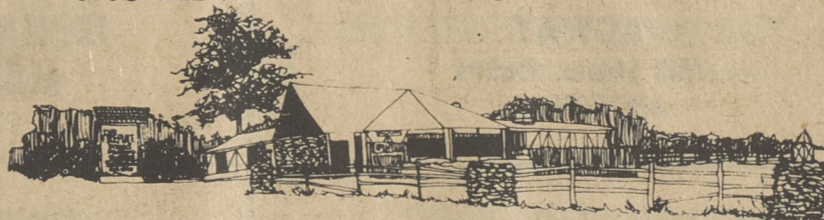
