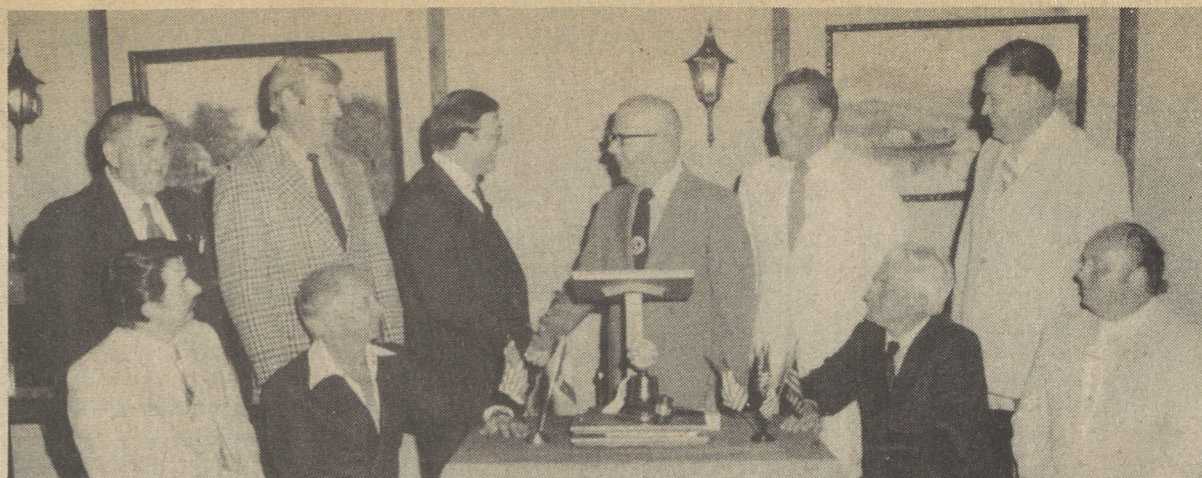
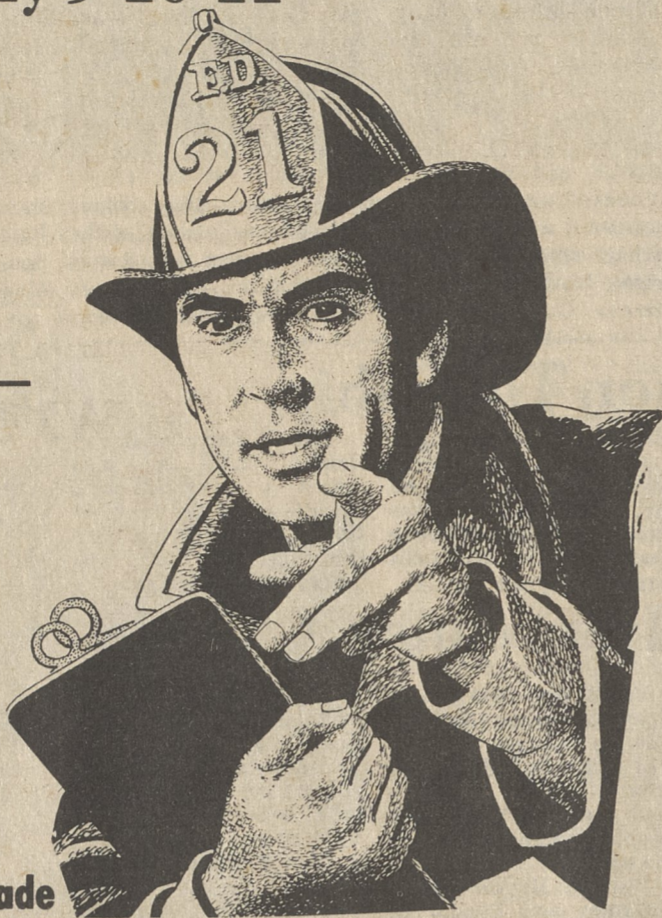

Police Reports
