## Sweet Valley flea market

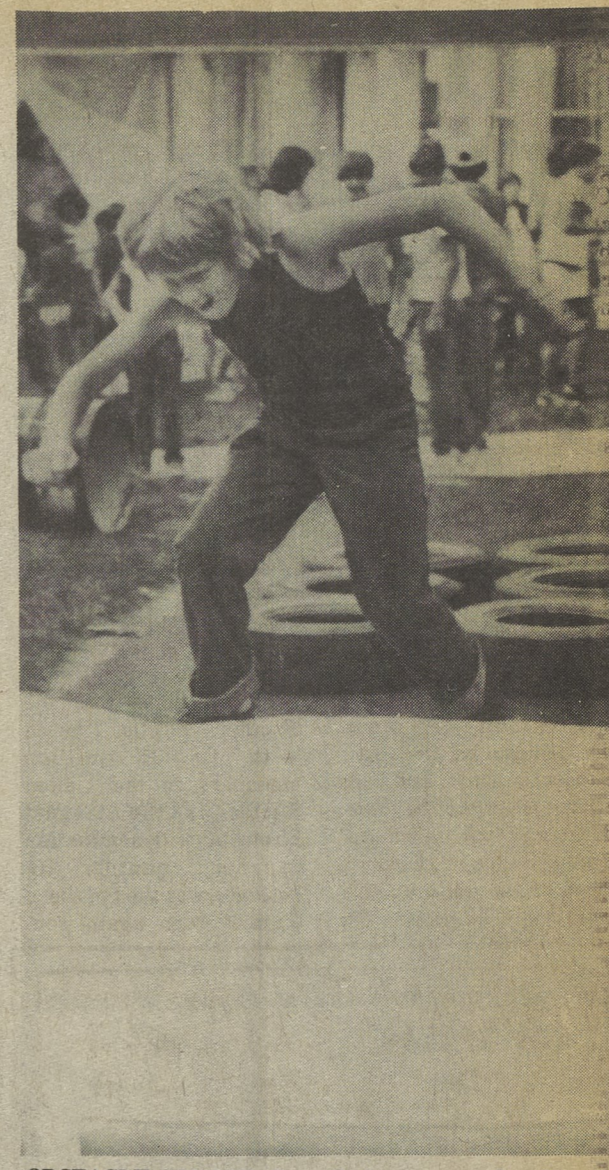
