

## **Gawlas issue mail** tips for vacationers

Before leaving on vacation several simple steps can make sure your mail is handled smoothly while you're away, Dallas Postmaster Bernard Gawlas said.

"Ask a neighbor or relative to remove mail and newspapers from your mailbox daily, or have mail held at the post office," he said.

"Awritten request to

hold mail up to 30 days can be given to your letter carrier or submitted at the local post office. If an extended absence is anticipated, a temporary mail forwarding order can be requested."

Postmaster Gawlas stressed the importance of not letting mail accumulate in a mailbox, saying "it's a sign even novice burglars can detect.
