Rev. Arnold Frichtenbaum Israeli war witness to speak at Dallas

The Rev. Arnold G. Fruchtenbaum will be the speaker at the Community Church of Dallas on Sunday, Aug. 24, at 11 a.m. and Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings, August 24-27, at 7 p.m. Fruchtenbaum is the director Ariel Ministries, a Jewish-Christian organization.

He was born in Siberia, Russia, while his parents were held prisoner in a Communist Concentration Camp. He received orthodox Jewish training while a young boy and came to New York with his family in 1951.

He received his training in theology at Cedarville College in Cedarville, Ohio and at the Dallas Theological Seminary. He studied Hebrew, archaeology, and ancient history at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem.

"Mr. Fruchtenbaum will be speaking on the topic Prophecy and the Jew," Pastor Wayne Brooks of the Community Church announced.

It was during this time that the now-historic, Six-Day War broke out between Israel and the Arab

At present he is a Ph.D. candidate at New York University. His first-hand observations of this critical period in Israel s history along with a thorough study of the Bible has brought him to certain conclusions about the role of the nation Israel and God's plan of world redemption.

In everything give thanks

Little Crystale Barber died on Jan. 19, 1975, at the age of 7 after a two year fight with a kidney disease. As her physical condition deteriorated, she became a living demonstration of faith in the Lord.

When Crystale was six years old, before the serious kidney problem developed, she received Christ as her personal Saviour at a children's Good news Club. Later, at the last meeting of a week of evangelistic services at the Bowman's Creek Free Methodist Church near Beaumont, Pa., she walked down the aisle publicly acknowledging her faith in Christ.

All week she had wanted to do this, but she would not unless her father went with her. So, moved and touched by his daughter's simple faith, Boyd Barber received

Christ as his personal Saviour on that eventful night. He joined his wife and daughter in their faith in Christ. That faith tapped the reservoir of Christ's infinite power

to bring them through the unseen crises that lay ahead. Shortly after that wonderul night at Bowman's Creek Church, Crystale was again stricken with a streph infection. Again, it settled in her kidneys. This time, the damage was irreparable.

In the weeks and months that followed, Crystale taught those around her the meaning of thanksgiving. One of her favorite Bible verses that guided the entire family through those turbulent times was Philippians 4:6-7 that states, "Be anxious for nothing; but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God And the peace of God which passes all understanding shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."

Crystale gave thanks to the Lord for everything. She thanked him at mealtimes even though the food was tasteless because of her bland diet. She thanked Him for the Christian radio station (WPEL-FM-Montrose), even when she could not go out and play. She thanked Him for the sunshine and the rain; the night and the day. She never complained.

Crystale's life of thanksgiving in Christ inspired all those around her, including her pediatrician. One day, Mrs. Barber asked the doctor why Crystale never complained about the intense pain that racked her body.

Mrs. Barber remarked, "The child must have a high pain level." The doctor though for a moment, and then replied, "I believe that she is able to endure the pain because she is so secure in her faith.'

Crystale's heart of thanksgiving issued from her confidence in Christ and His presence with her. She yearned to be with Christ. Two weeks before she died, she said, "I cannot wait to go to heaven to be with Jesus." Her confidence in Christ's presence caused her to be able to give thanks in everything-even in the midst of
