## LCCC student wins scholarship

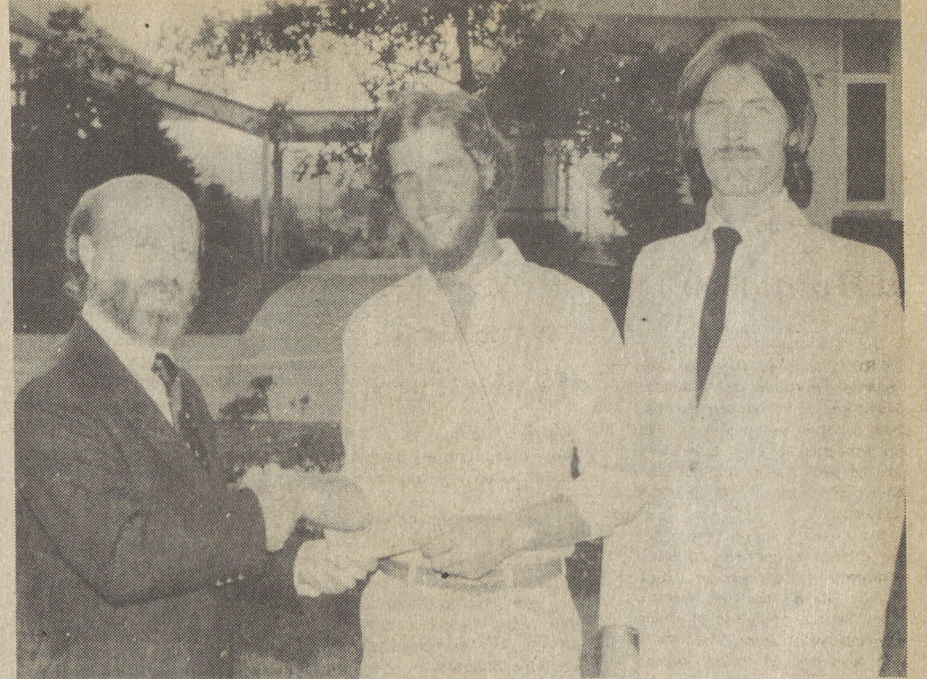
