Venald Bovard Jr., president of the board of Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic, has announced that the season's first board meeting will be held Sept. 17 at noon at The Woodlands in Wilkes-Barre. The orchestra board will be joined by those of the Scranton and Wilkes-Barre Philharmonic Women's Leagues, and members of the Wilkes-Barre organization will host the event.

In announcing the meeting, Bovard indicated that the session will focus on final considerations for the 1980-81 "Season of Stars," which begins Sept. 26 at the Masonic Temple in Scranton and Sept. 27 at the Irem Temple, Wilkes-Barre. Noting that new board members were elected in June at the orchestra's annual meeting, Bovard again thanked those who have finished their terms of service and welcomed

new members. He stressed the importance of the board's efforts in the continued success of the Philharmonic and predicted that the upcoming season would be a "most extraordinary one" for the regional professional symphony.

The president pointed out, however, that subscribers are important to the orchestra's present and future success and noted the availability of season tickets in both cities for the Philharmonic's seven-concert program.

"As more and more of our concerts continue to sell out," Bovard said, "subscriptions are a practical solution to the very real problem of obtaining concert tickets--concert-goers don't have to stand in line, can't be disappointed at the last minute, and perhaps most significantly, save money over box office prices."
