

Dallas blood drive set for Thursday

"Whilst we enjoy gifts from our families at Christmas, some unknown person desperately ill, is needing the most precious gift". This was the message of

the American Red Cross to the planning meeting for the Dallas Blood Drive to be held at the United Methodist Church on Jan. 2.

The Blood Drive Committee met at the home of Ann Calkins on Dec. 23 to discuss the setting up of a blood donor session at short notice to help out with current shortage of blood. Duties were assigned to the 15

volunteers who have already come forward to offer their time and help. The program was outlined by a representative from the Red Cross; he explained the need for volunteers to staff the Bloodmobile in the capacity of registrars, escorts, babysitters, canteen help and platelets drivers. They also will be telephone canvassing for donors and for this a technique teach-in was

held. One volunteer will attend the Blood Services Center for training. The Dallas United Methodist Church offered their premises at short notice and have been very helpful in providing facilities and volunteers. The collection will be from 1-6 p.m. on Jan. 2. Naparsteck will teach workshop on PR and communications

A workshop on Public Relations and Communication will be held by Penn State-Wilkes-Barre on Jan. 22 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Master Hosts Inn, Kidder Street, Wilkes-Barre.

The workshop, sponsored by the Office of Continuing Education at

Penn State-Wilkes-Barre, is designed for all persons, professional and non-professional, who are responsible for public relations in their organizations.

The workshop will cover such topics and writing for newspapers, radio, and television;

handling photographs; designing, printing, and distributing brochures and pamphlets; structuring a public relations that they wish to discuss.

The instructor for the workshop will be Martin J. Naparsteck, public information officer at Penn State-Wilkes-Barre.

County loses 4,724 in census

The Bureau of the Census has notified the Board of the Luzerne County Commissioners that the field operations for the 1980 Decennial Census have been completed. Vincent Barabba, Census Bureau director, thanked the Board for its cooperation and reported the official preliminary population count for Luzerne County to be 337,632, and the housing count as 135,914. The population count is 9,546 higher than the unofficial

figure of 328,086 which was released in August, while the housing count dropped 1,644 from 137,558.

These revised figures show the decline from the 1970 population of 341,956 to be 4,324 rather than the 13,870 drop originally reported. However, there was an increase of 19,071 total dwelling units in the last decade. The County Planning Commission's staff filed 179 pages of challenging against the

August figures, and the new totals apparently reflect corrections and rechecks made as a result of those and other challenges by Municipalities in the County.

The official preliminary results will be replaced later by the final counts which will appear in the published reports released by the Census Bureau after they have undergone further processing and review.

Naparsteck has headed the public relations program at the local Penn State campus for two years. Before that he worked as a reporter and editor for three newspapers, the Pocono Record in Stroudsburg, the Derrick in Oil City, and Grit, a nationally circulated weekly published in Williamsport.

His first novel, "War Song," was published by Leisure books in March 1980; his second novel, "A Hero's Welcome," will be published by the same publisher in July, 1981. His shorter writings have appeared in such publications as "The Philadelphia Inquirer," "The Humanist," "Library College Journal," "The Military Journal," and elsewhere. He holds an M.A. in creative writing from DePauw University in Greencastle, Ind., and a B.A. in political science

from Wilkes College. He has won several journalism and writing awards.

A \$30 fee for attending the workshop will be charged. The fee covers the costs of attending the workshop, all in-

structional material, coffee, and lunch.
