### Crispells observe 25th

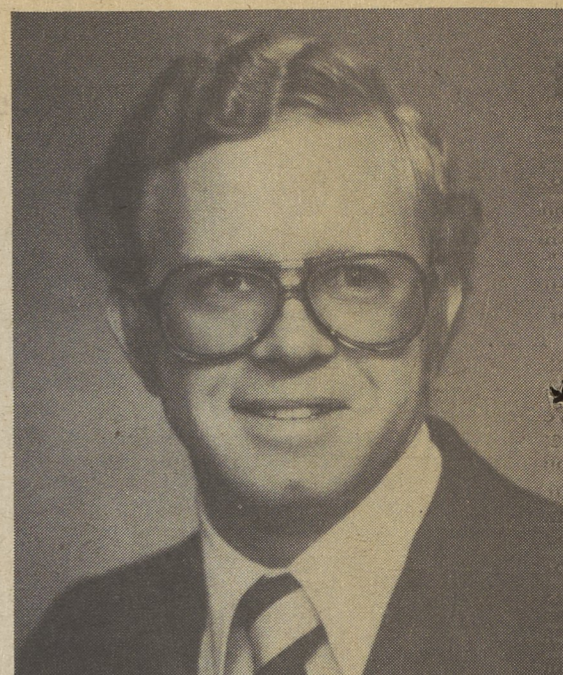

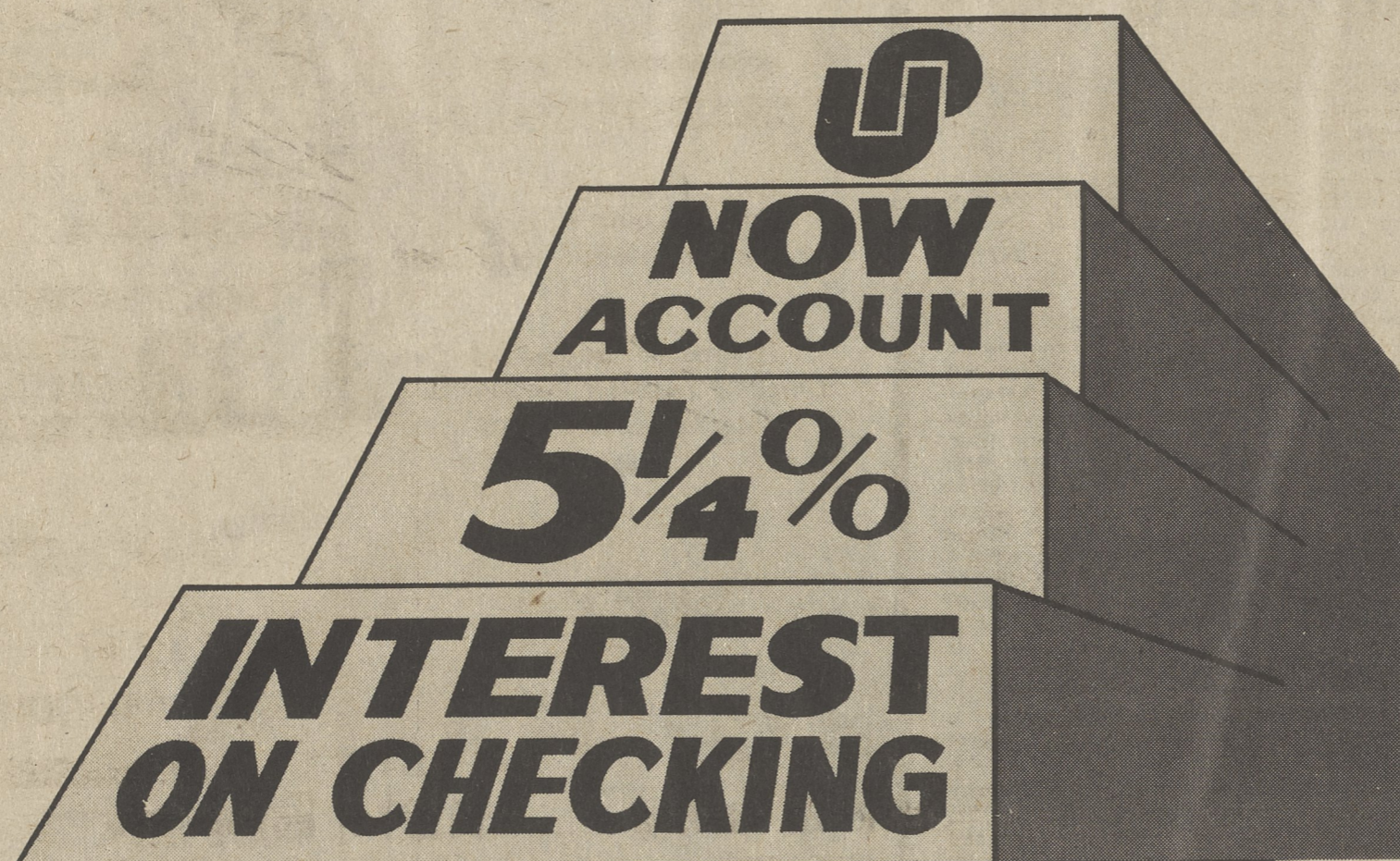
### Stoudt charged \$1,526

A case involving a Boyertown man who allegedly fired a shotgun at a Back Mountain home in December was settled before District Magistrate Earl Gregory of Shavertown last week with the defendant paying restitution and costs.

Bruce Stoudt, 22, of Boyertown, was required to pay the sum of \$1,526

and court costs. He was arrested Dec. 27 and committed initially to Luzerne County Prison in default of \$10,000 following an incident which he allegedly created a disturbance at the home of Jake Casterline, Alderson Heights, fired two shotgun blasts at the front door, and broke in, eventually being disarmed.
