

DHS enacts JOBS program

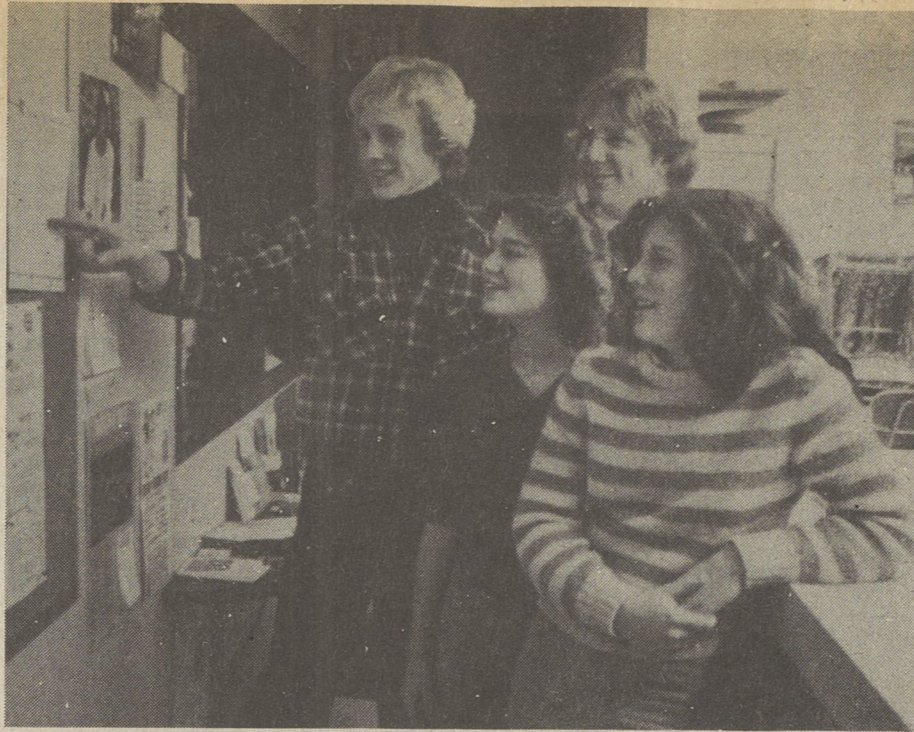
Recognizing the need for a comprehensive, organized job placement program to assist the young people of Dallas Senior High School, the Dallas Guidance Department has enacted a JOBS (Job Opportunity Bureau for Students) program, under the direction of Barbara Price, counselor coordinator, and John Farkas, senior counselor, for the 1980-81 school year.

The Jobs program will fulfill two necessary needs concerning youth and their quest for employment. The first phase of the program involved having the senior class under the guidance of John Farkas, undertake a series of sessions on job-seeking activities. Students were provided with information relative to civil rights, equal employment legislation, wage and hour laws, right to privacy, etc. They were administered the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Ability Battery) to aid in understanding their abilities and job aptitudes. The

class was also instructed in how to complete application forms, and engaged in role-playing to give a realistic approach to interviewing procedures used when applying for a job.

The second phase of the program involved contacting several hundred job sites in Luzerne County to secure information regarding job availability, wages, benefits, and contact people. The information from the returned data sheets will be cross matched with index cards, which the seniors filled out listing what types of jobs they would be interested in, both full-time or part-time.

The goal of this project is to provide students with as many job opportunities as possible either on a full-time, or part-time basis. The Guidance Department would appreciate any area businesses, who might have job openings for students, to contact John Farkas at the Dallas Senior High School.

Locals sing in Lycoming College choir

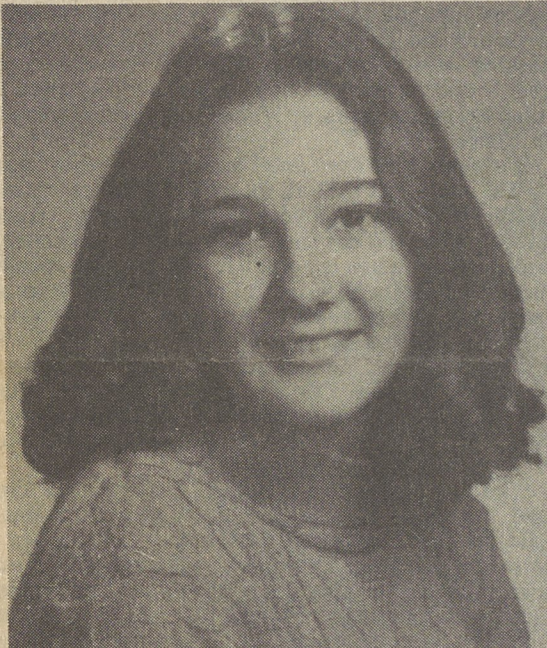
Margaret Daring, Dallas, and Rebekah
