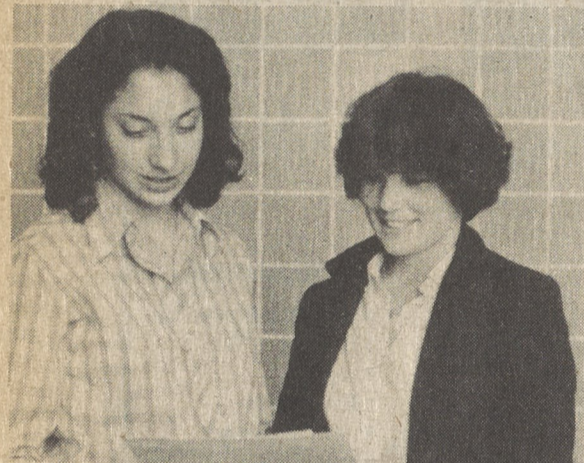
Dallas holds Honor Society induction
