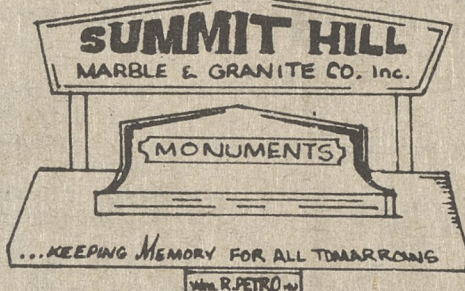

Noxen Township voting results tabulated

Mrs. Barbara Keiper will be Noxen Township's new tax collector, starting in January. She captured the Republican and Democratic nominations in the May 19 primary election and will be unopposed in the November general election. Mrs. Keiper received 123 votes from Noxen Republicans and

garnered 61 votes from Noxen Township Democrats to win both nominations. In January, she will succeed her mother-in-law, Mrs. Grace Keiper, who did not seek reelection.

In other balloting for township offices, George Brody received 42 votes to capture the GOP

nomination for a six-year term as township auditor. Paul Paci won both nominations for a seat on the township's three-member board of supervisors, getting 87 Republican votes and 54 votes from Noxen Democrats.

Jean Denmon won the four-year term as judge of

elections in Noxen Township with 20 GOP and 18 Democratic votes. Lucille Blizard received 118 votes from Republicans for that party's nomination as inspector of election. David Harris won election as township assessor with 16 votes against five other opponents.

In the main, Noxen Township voters supported winners in the statewide Supreme, Superior and Commonwealth Court Judgeship races, as well

as for Wyoming County offices of coroner, county treasurer, district attorney and jury commissioner races. Thomas Kukucka received 106 GOP votes for County Coroner; Carl Smith was high in the county treasurer race here in Noxen, getting 122 votes; Brandon Vanston was high man in the D.A. contest, and Bob Ferguson polled 76 votes to 37 for Sylvia Rapsner in the jury commissioner race.

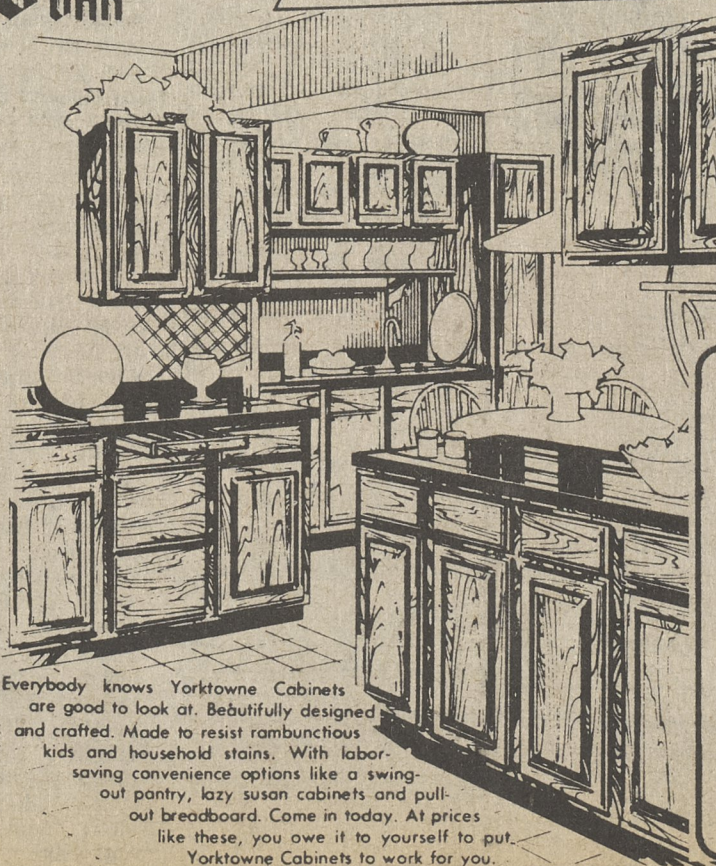

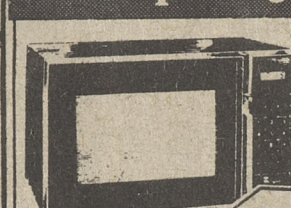
