

Davis will conduct clinic

Jack Davis, Clarion State College Assistant coach, will once again conduct the "Clarion Way" Wrestling School at West-Side Tech High School from August 2 to 7, 1981, enabling local wrestlers to gain additional expertise from a staff of highly qualified wrestling champs.

Daily sessions will be held from Monday through Friday for wrestlers eight years of age and older who will participate in an intensified week of the latest techniques and drills for the Elementary, Junior and Senior High programs. Wrestling films and weight lifting programs will also be available.

The Clarion State wrestling program has been nationally ranked for the past ten years,
