Copies of these ordinances may be obtained directly from the Borough

The Council by, and through this advertisement wishes to notify the residents, non-residents and people visiting the Borough of Harveys Lake that these ordinances are currently in legal effect and the Council

First the brush, grass and weeds ordinance requires that any person owning or occupying any property, to remove, trim or cut all grass, weeds or other vegetation at least twice a month during the summer months of May, June, July, August and September. This ordinance does not apply to any property that would be considered open acreage or field or wooded area that are not between residential or commercial properties. All other property, for example, residential, commercial property, and vacant field between residential or commercial property must be in

Secondly the Council has adopted an ordinance the accumulation of rubbish or garbage, requires all neat and /or aesthetic in appearance.
