The hurricane season is still with us into September and October, reports the Luzerne

County Air Defence Center. The greatest hurricane ever to hit the U.S.A. struck the Florida

Keys with 200 M.P.H. winds on Labor Day in 1935 and in 1900, September 8th, the greatest

weather disaster in U.S. history occurred, when a tide washed over Galveston Island killing 6,000 people.

September 10, 1919 a severe Hurricane struck the Florida Keys; September 11, 1961 - Hurricane Carla; September 12, 1960 - Hurricane Donna; September 14, 1979 - Tropical Storm Frederic dumped seven inches of rain on Erie, Pennsylvania; September 16, 1928 a Hurricane drove Lake Okechobee on land killing 1,800 people; September 18, 1926 - the Great Miami Hurricane drove the ocean into Biscayne Bay.  
We must be concerned with tornadoes in September, recalling the tornadoes of September 24, 1977 in Erie, Lawrence, Mercer and Venango Counties in Pennsylvania.  
Past history certainly indicates the high rate of occurrence of hurricane and tornado conditions in the month of September for our particular region.
