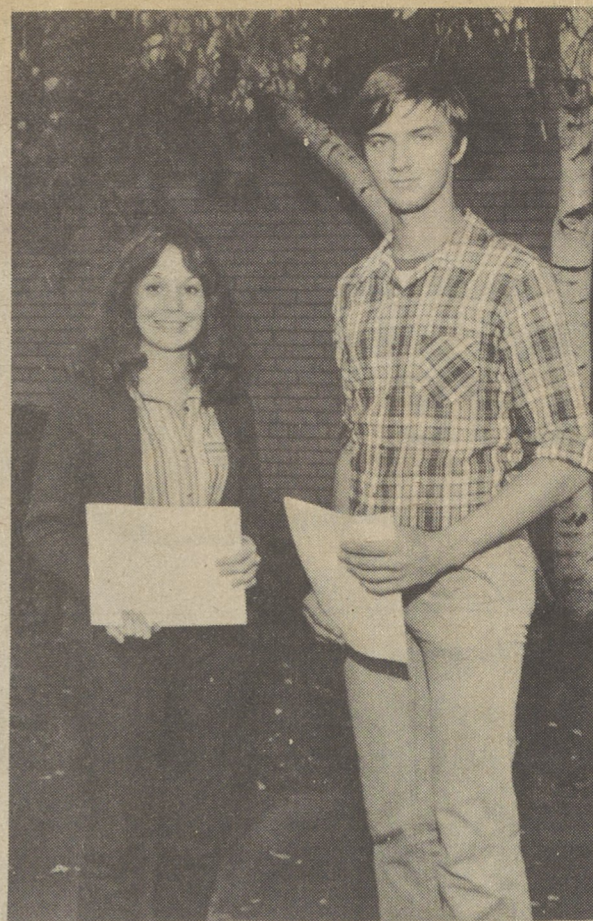
Edward W. Parsons, son of Vivian and Edward W. Parsons Jr., Box 41 Lehman, recently completed a cadet summer training cruise to Europe.

Ms. Akers is the daughter of Rev. and Mrs. Douglas N. Akers, 65 Saginaw St., Dallas.

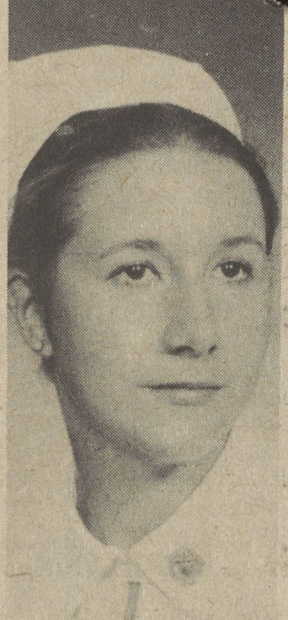
