## Barbose wins local Century III award

Jeffrey J. Barbose, a senior at Dallas Senior High School, has been named the top Century III Leader in a competition there, according to Edgar W. Hughes, Jr., principal. The 17-year-old student is now eligible to compete with other local winners from around the state for one of two \$1,500 scholarships and an all-expense-paid trip to the national Century III Leaders Conference, slated for March 5-8, 1982 in Colonial Williamsburg, Va. State winners will compete for the national winner's

prize of an additional \$10,000 scholarship.

The Century III Leaders program is designed to bring together and recognize student leaders who show both strong leadership abilities and an interest in the future of America. Jeff was judged on the basis of leadership skills, school and community involvement, and a current events examination. He also wrote a short essay on a particular issue which challenges America in its third

century.

Runners-up in the competition at Dallas Senior High School were Randa Fahmy, Nancie Fitch, and Mary Klukosky.

This is the seventh year of the Century III Leaders program, which awards a total of \$218,500 in scholarships to 204 young leaders. Century III is sponsored and administered by the National Association of Secondary School Principals, and funded by the Shell Oil Company. Jeffrey is the son of Mr.

and Mrs. John Barbose of Lehigh Street in Shavertown. He is president of the senior class and is active in the Gifted Program, National Honor Society, and the Band. He won the high school award for German and three NEDT Certificates for scholastic achievement. This past summer he participated in the King's College Honors Program and the Computer Science program for High School Juniors at the Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology in Terre Haute, Indiana.
