Jeffrey J. Barbose, a senior at Dallas Senior High School, has been named the top Century III Leader in a competition there, according to Edgar W. Hughes, Jr., principal.

The 17-year-old student is now eligible to compete with other local winners from around the state for one of two \$1,500 scholarships and an all-expensepaid trip to the national Century III Leaders Conference, slated for March 5-8, 1982 in Colonial Williamsburg, Va. State winners will compete for the national winner's

prize of an additional \$10,000 scholarship.

The Century III Leaders program is designed to bring together and recognize student leaders who show both strong leadership abilities and an interest in the future of America. Jeff was judged on the basis of leadership skills, school and community involvement, and a current events examination.
