As a special treat, Santa Claus will visit the Carnival and talk to all

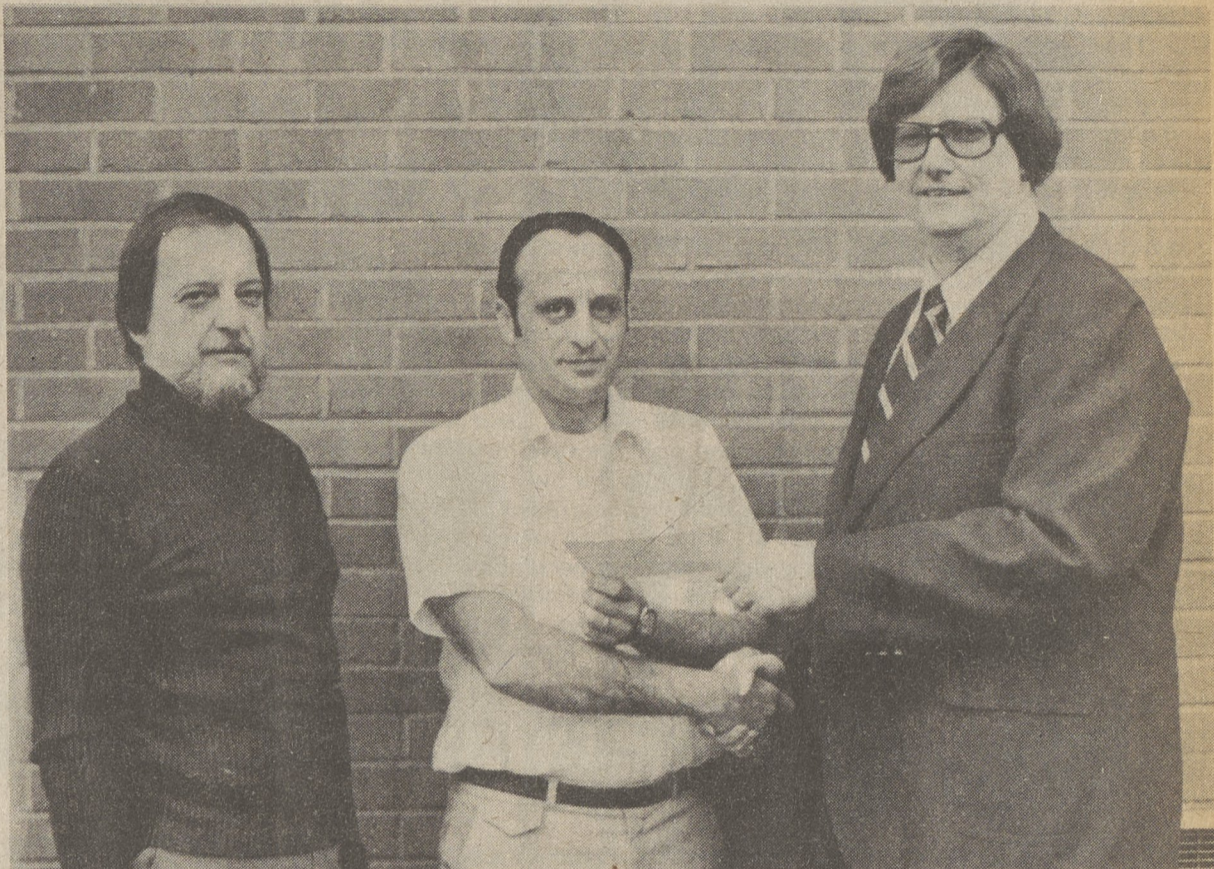
youngsters. Parents may bring their own camera and take pictures.

**Medical Society offering scholarship**

The Luzerne County Medical Society Auxiliary announces that it is seeking a recipient for its 1982 scholarship. The scholarship is based on scholastic ability as well as financial need. Up to \$500 per semester for a total of four semesters will be awarded to a senior high school student entering a program of

study in an allied, medical health field.

The total grant will not exceed \$2000 and must be used for a student's tuition.

Allied, medical health careers include those careers which primarily assist the physician in the practice of medicine. Nursing, X-ray technology, medical

technology, pharmacy and physical therapy are some examples of allied, medical health careers.

Senior high school students who are planning this type of career are urged to apply for this grant. Scholarship ap-

plications are available at high school guidance offices throughout the Wyoming Valley area.
