# Noxen looking for turn around in community

Prominent civic leaders of Noxen Township are looking forward to a 'turnaround' in that community's progress following the demolition of the former Noxen Tannery. The Tannery, closed since 1953, is a group of dilapidated buildings that has been a 'community blight' the last two decades.

Demolition is tentatively scheduled to begin next month.

Representatives of 15 northeastern Pennsylvania firms have shown interest in acquiring the demolition contract since the authority advertised last month for bidders. A pre-ward conference was held last Tuesday in Tunkhannock and the authority expects to receive in the neighborhood of 10 actual the proposals for

domolition. Proposals on the cost of the demolition will be opened in the Wyoming County Redevelopment and Housing Authority offices on Route 309, Eaton Township, Friday morning at 11.
