

Saucy barbecue spare-ribs and poppyseed cakes

Does a vacation that includes visiting Sea World, Kings Island, Opreyland and Elvis Presley's Graceland Manor sound exciting? Last summer Jan Carey, her husband, Ken, and their children spent two wonderful weeks camping and enjoying these interesting sites. Camping is a family hobby and although the Careys have taken many enjoyable vacations, last summer's was the best according to Jan.

A resident of Harveys Lake all her life, Jan is very involved in community activities. She is president of the Lake-Noxen PTA, Den Mother for Pack 331, secretary of the Harveys Lake Little League and a member of the Long Range Planning Committee for School Improvement in the Lake-Lehman School District. On Tuesday, her day off from working in the kitchen at the Carpenter's Nursing Home in Idetown, Jan donates her time aiding in the kindergarten of Lake-Noxen School.

Jan's husband, Ken, a Pringle native, is road foreman of Harveys Lake Borough. The Careys have two children, Kevin, age 11 and Tiffany 7. Kevin, a sixth grade student at Lake-Noxen Elementary School, participates in the PTA Basketball League, is a Boy Scout and plays Little

Naturally since Jan's job requires that she excel in the kitchen, Jan enjoys cooking. Her recipe for Bar-B-Q Spareribs calls for tabasco, Worcestershire sauce, dry mustard and lemon juice. These saucy ribs have a zesty flavor, having been simmered in a combination of sherry and water before baking in the spicy sauce.

Cabbage, Kielbasi and Sea Shells may sound like an unusual dish, but Jan says that the flavors blend deliciously.

When Jan's family found out that she would be appearing in the Post Cookbook, Ken told her that she must submit her recipe for Poppyseed Cake, one of his favorites. Kevin, on the other hand, requested the Chocolate Fudge recipe, which is a favorite of his. Both are tasty, sweet treats.

BAR-B-Q SPARERIBS
2 1/2 c. water
1/2 c. cooking sherry
1 c. chopped onion
1 c. chopped green pepper, sauteed in margarine
2 T. ketchup
dash tabasco
2 T. lemon juice
2 T. brown sugar
1 t. dry mustard
1 clove garlic
1/4 c. Worcestershire

sauce
1 t. salt
1/2 t. pepper
1/2 c. vinegar
1 lg. piece spareribs
Brown ribs in a large pan. Add sherry and water. Cook, covered, on low heat 1 hour; drain. Combine remaining ingredients, mix well. Add sauce to spareribs. Bake for one hour at 350 degrees.
CABBAGE, KIELBASI AND SEA SHELLS
1 ring smoked kielbasi
1 sm. head cabbage
3/4 c. margarine

1/2 lb. sea shell macaroni
Shred cabbage coarsely. Sautee in margarine until tender. Cut kielbasi into small chunks. Place on top of cabbage. Cook long enough to heat the kielbasi through. Cook and drain shells. Add to kielbasi and cabbage.
POPPYSEED CAKE
3 c. flour
2 c. sugar
1 1/2 c. salad oil
4 eggs
1 t. vanilla
1/2 t. salt
1 1/2 t. baking soda
1 lg. can evaporated milk

1 jar poppyseed filling
1 c. chopped nuts, optional
Combine flour, sugar, salad oil, eggs, vanilla, salt, baking soda and evaporated milk. Add poppyseed filling and nuts. Pour into an ungreased tube pan. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour and 15 minutes.
CHOCOLATE FUDGE
4 c. sugar
1 can evaporated milk
1 c. butter
12 oz. pkg. chocolate chips
1 pt. marshmallow creme
1 t. vanilla

1 c. walnuts, chopped
1 c. peanut butter, optional
Combine sugar, milk and butter. Cook over heat until mixture comes to a boil. Boil until it forms a small ball when dropped into cold water. Remove from heat. Add remaining ingredients blending well. Pour into a buttered pan. Chill. Cut into squares.

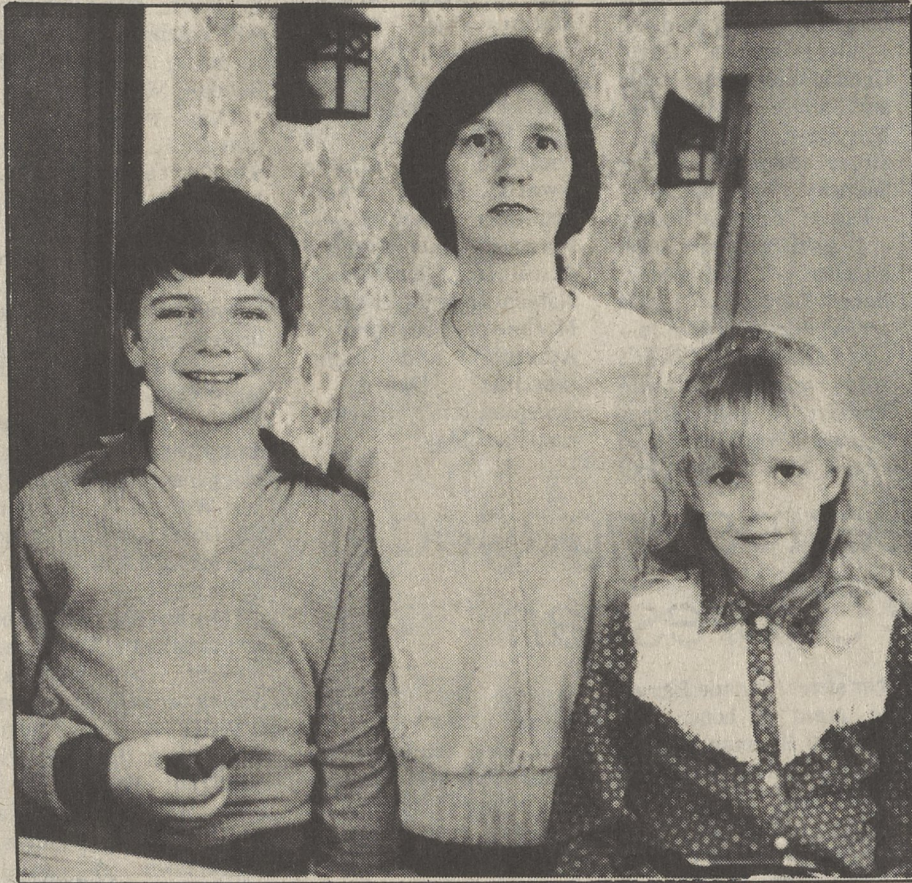

Cars on display at Library

Pinewood Derby Cars -- then and now! We have in our display case at the library for the next four weeks 21 cars loaned to us by Cub Scout Pack 281 and 3 cars loaned by the Kozemchak brother.

Pack 281 is sponsored by Dallas Methodist Church which held it's annual Pinewood Derby in January. I talked with Nancy McDonald, Den Leader, coach, and unit commissioner, and was able to borrow these cars

and other items. The cars are displayed on the actual finish line of the derby track, which just fits inside the library's glass case. January is usually derby month with Cub Scouts and each Cub is given his kit in December. They are given a month to complete the car. The kit has the pinewood block of wood, four axles and four wheels. Cubs must draw a design, cut it out of the block, sand, and paint it with their own personal design. Up to five ounces of weight is allowable in the bottom of the car. This project has always been a fther-son combined effort.
